Tacoma Rental Assistance Program



- 683 Households served with rental assistance
 - 62% of households headed by a person of color
- 1,450 households served with utility assistance
- \$6,370,508 in funds distributed

Addressing Garbage and Debris




- Two contractors addressing litter and debris removal from encampments
 - Over 315 tons of trash removed to date
 - Each Council District receives service at least 1x/week
 - ARPA investment of \$300,000
- HIRE program
 - ARPA investment of \$240,000 to extend through 2022


Tacoma's Neighborhood Cleanup Programs



The City of Tacoma offers a variety of programs and services to keep our homes, neighborhoods and environment clean and healthy.

Adopt-a-Spot & Neighborhood Litter Patrol (253) 591-5000 cityoftacoma.org/litter	Help reduce litter and keep our public spaces clean by volunteering with the Adopt-a-Spot or Neighborhood Litter Patrol programs. Volunteers receive free safety and litter pick-up supplies.
Call-2-Haul (253) 502-2100, Option 3 cityoftacoma.org/call2haul	Schedule a pickup of large bulky items. Up to 3 large items and 15 boxes or bags of small items of garbage can be collected with Call-2-Haul. Visit the website for a list of acceptable items.
Encampment Debris Removal (253) 591-5000 or 3-1-1 cityoftacoma.org/TacomaFirst311	Report an encampment location that may benefit from debris or litter removal. The City contracts with several companies to remove debris and litter from active and abandoned encampments in public rights-of-way. Most cleanup locations are identified by the Homeless Outreach Team and many locations are cleaned on a regular basis.
Green Events Program cityoftacoma.org/greenevents sustainability@cityoftacoma.org	Make your next event a green event. The Green Events Program recognizes events that have a sustainable impact, like encouraging sustainable transportation, donating food, and using recycled materials. Not-for-profit events may be eligible for Environmental Services Event Support, which may include free or discounted in-kind services such as garbage and recycling services, food waste bins, and/or portable toilets.
HIRE (Helping Individuals Experiencing Homelessness) (253) 301-2134 valeovocation.org	HIRE is a low-barrier work program that offers no-cost beautification and litter abatement services to businesses. Tacoma businesses interested in using this service and those seeking employment through the program can contact Valeo Vocation at (253) 301-2134.

- Site capacity = **25 beds**
- Site operational early December

RISE Center

- Contract negotiations underway
- Site capacity = **35 beds**
- Site operational late November

Comfort Inn

- Site capacity = **120 beds**
- Property sale closed 10/29/21
- Virtual community meeting 11/22/21
- Site operational by the end of 2021

Total new beds by end of 2021 = 180
Work continues to locate additional sites

Vision: Sustain an equitable, dignified, and culturally responsive homeless and housing response system that quickly and effectively addresses everyone's homeless crisis while supporting the needs of local residents and businesses.

Mission: Collaborate with citywide initiatives and strategies, and regional partners and stakeholders to support long term permanent housing and provide supportive services to people experiencing homelessness in Tacoma. We provide real solutions to creating a thriving community by immediately responding to the needs of encampments for residents, the surrounding neighborhoods and local businesses and by providing immediate access to emergency shelter, health and wellness services and permanent, safe and stable housing to everyone experiencing homelessness in this city.

Goals:


- 1) Ensure affordable housing is available and accessible to Tacoma residents.

- 3) The shelter system in Tacoma offers all people a safe and dignified experience that is easy to access.
- 4) Tacoma's homeless service system provides individuals and families with access to a continuum of tailored supports to prevent and end homelessness.
- 5) Tacoma's homeless service system provides Individuals and families with access to permanent, stable housing in order to end the cycle of homelessness.
