
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2012 Council Districts

### What is Redistricting?

Redistricting is the redrawing of electoral district boundaries to adjust for population growth.

Redistricting is required by federal law every 10 years, following completion of US Census (last redistricting was completed in 2012)

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### **Redistricting Guidelines**

Updating voting districts based on population growth, as required by state and federal law

Follow the States Redistricting Plan (RCW 44.05.090) which specifies:


- Equal population
- Compact, contiguous, convenient
- Minimize splitting political (city, county line etc.) and geographic boundaries
- Preserve communities of interest
- Prohibit undue favoritism to party or group
- Provide fair and effective representation


## Tacoma's Redistricting Criteria

A deviation of +/-500 (Approximately 1% of each district) people from the target population is acceptable


We want to maintain consistency between 2010 and 2020 where possible

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
# Creating the Scenarios • We created 3 scenarios that provide different options using existing boundaries to follow • The scenarios are presented in order of the least amount of change to the most amount of change • Each scenario has a guiding methodology used to dictate changes • Three different scenarios is how redistricting was presented to Council in 2012




Scenario I


- Least amount of change from 2012 map
- All districts are withing the +/-500 goal
- Districts 1-4 are within 200 from goal population
- District 5 has almost 200 more people than the next highest and almost 550 more people than the lowest.







