## ITEM/ISSUE PROPOSED FOR COUNCIL CONSIDERATION:

I respectfully request City Council concurrence for a \$10,000 City Council Contingency Fund request to support the 2022 Tacoma Reads Together events.

## **BRIEF BACKGROUND:**

"Tacoma Reads" is our beloved, local community reads program, where the larger community is encouraged to read, think, and discuss compelling and meaningful themes from a selected book. The City works with Tacoma Public Library to select titles for adult, young adult, and children and their families around a shared theme; develop programming; and arrange for a Tacoma event with the author of the adult selection. This year the following titles have been selected:

The children's and families selection for the 2022 Tacoma Reads program is a Caldecott Honor, a New York Times Editors' Choice, and a Junior Library Guild selection, <u>Thank you, Omu</u> by Oge Mora, a beautifully illustrated picture book about the concepts of generosity and care for one's community for our youngest Tacoma readers.

For young adults, this year's selection is <u>We Belong</u> by Cookie Hiponia, is an immigration story of resilience with elements of Filipino folklore woven throughout. The unique format of this book, as it's told in verse, will inspire our teen readers to tell their own stories.

The 2022 adult title is <u>Afterlife</u> by Julia Alvarez, a trailblazing Latinx author who wrote the beloved novels "How the Garcia Girls Lost Their Accents" and "In the Time of the Butterflies". In this brilliant book, Julia asks the meaningful question, "How do we live in a broken world without losing faith in one another or ourselves?" Tacoma Reads programming will include an event with Julia Alvarez that is tailored to the Tacoma community this fall.

In alignment with Resolution No. 40622, the 2022 Tacoma Reads will engage the community in conversations and programming that explore the topics of Race, Social Justice, and Healing. If approved, this would mark the fourth year that the City Council has provided a \$10,000 sponsorship of Tacoma Reads. This support has expanded Tacoma Reads to include titles for readers of all ages and allowed a broader range of outreach and greater community conversation on the selected titles, even as Tacoma Public Library has moved to virtual programming.
