Mayor Woodards expressed appreciation for the assistance she received in creating Resolution No. 40920.

REPORTS BY THE CITY MANAGER

City Manager Pauli reported that the City received \$389,000 in United States Department of the Treasury funds to further support the City's efforts in providing utility assistance to individuals in the community who have been impacted by COVID-19, noting the funds are a result of reallocated funds from other jurisdictions who are unable to fully expend their rental assistance awards, and this funding is in addition to the amount the City has received in emergency rental assistance to support rental and utility assistance. She further provided an update on the effort for better data related to air quality and equity in the City, noting the City is leading an effort to better understand equity and air quality issues, and as a result from the first phase of the project the City was identified as an ideal location to test a prototype air sensor and to begin measurable observations about air quality and tie them to the Tacoma Equity Index. She concluded by stating that the goal is to paint a broad picture about outdoor air quality across the neighborhoods, that the data comparisons will also be used by the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department, and that air sensors were installed at local schools.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Economic Development Committee

Council Member Blocker, Chair of the Economic Development Committee, reported that the February 8, 2022, meeting was cancelled; and on February 22, 2022, the Committee received presentations on Tacoma-based Black, Indigenous, and People of Color executive round table findings and recommendations, and on American Rescue Plan Act business assistance for window replacement grants. He concluded by stating the next meeting will be held on March 8, 2022, at 10:00 a.m., through Zoom.

Government Performance and Finance Committee

Council Member Hines, Chair of the Government Performance and Finance Committee, reported at the February 15, 2022, meeting, the Committee received presentations on the Rainer Connect contract, metrics for the City Council and Public Utility Board to return to in-person meetings, and Tacoma Water's long-range financial plan; at today's meeting, the Committee received presentations on the monthly budget update and the installation of Advanced Metering Infrastructure; and that the March 15, 2022, has been cancelled. He concluded by stating the next meeting will be held on April 5, 2022, at 10:00 a.m., through Zoom, and will include presentations on the monthly budget update, Tacoma Public Utilities' financial policies and strategic directives, and Tacoma Power's long-range financial plan.

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Mayor Woodards expressed appreciation for Council Member and community member participation in last week's Council retreat and provided next steps, noting meeting with staff from the Media and Communications Office to talk about City Council priorities, followed by another retreat, and that Council Members will receive an outline of the process.
