PUBLIC PROPERTY ENCAMPMENT REMOVA

- Authorization based on:
 - Emergent public health and safety impacts
 - Size of encampment or type of activity
 - Unmanageable environmental impacts
 - Planned public work needs
- City has initiated 11 removals from public property since January 2022 (City and State property)

PRIVATE PROPERTY ENCAMPMENT ABATEMENT PILOT PROGRAM



- Council authorization for funding and program launch in December 2021
- Provides support for trespass and removal of debris
- Performed 11 private property encampment abatements since launch

- Brotherhood RISE 2135 MLK Jr Way
 - · Capacity 35 adults
 - Anticipated Opening in July 2022
- Tacoma Rescue Mission 35th and Pacific
 - · Capacity 50 adults
 - Anticipated Opening in August 2022
- Total anticipated capacity
 - Increased by 85
- · Total available shelter
 - Capacity 1,225
- Response since 2017 declaration of emergency:
 - Increased by 577

 - Mitigation Site Shelter
 - Serves 50 individuals at a time
 - Case Manager and Employment Opportunities Available
 - Hygiene Services
 - Cedar Fencing and Vegetation
 - Community Outreach will begin week of June 27th
 - Operational as early as August 2022
