1 2	BY REQUEST OF DEPUTY MAYOR USHKA, AND COUNCIL MEMBERS BUSHNELL AND RUMBAUGH
3	A RESOLUTION authorizing the one-time use of funds in the amount of \$35,000, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, for the restoration of the
4 5	street clock on Broadway in Downtown Tacoma.
6	WHEREAS the street clock ("Clock") currently located in front of LeRoy
7	Jewelers, was brought to the City by Abraham Rose in 1920, and
8	WHEREAS Mr. Rose installed the Clock in front of his jewelry stored located
9	at South 14th Street and Pacific Avenue, where it remained for about 50 years, until
10	it was damaged by a delivery truck in the late 1960s or early 1970s, taken down,
11	and stored in a City warehouse for over a decade, and
12	WHEREAS, in 1985, LeRoy Jewelers, who knew the Rose family and were
13 14	familiar with the Clock, decided to make a statement by bringing the Clock back to
15	life, and
16	WHEREAS LeRoy Jewelers paid over \$10,000 for the reconstruction of the
17	Clock, and Simon Rose agreed to gift the Clock to the City under the condition the
18	City would maintain it, and
19 20	WHEREAS in 1987 the repairs to the Clock were finished, and during a
21	community dedication and celebration, it was placed in its present location on
22	Broadway between South 9th Street and South 11th Street, and
23	WHEREAS earlier this year, after 35 years of constant use and wear, the
24	Clock was intentionally stopped due to the gears needing to be repaired, as well as
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other structural and cosmetic issues which need to be addressed to fully restore the Clock, and

2 WHEREAS to allow the Clock to continue running in its current condition 3 would invite a catastrophic failure which would destroy the clockworks entirely, and 4 WHEREAS the City researched repairing the Clock, and in May 2022, the 5 6 City received a recommendation and estimate of cost to include repairs to the case 7 and motion, movement general, gear train, escapement mechanism, winding 8 mechanism, cosmetic improvements, and final regulation and adjustments, and 9 WHEREAS a cost estimate of \$17,160, which only addresses four of the 10 eight areas of work, does not account for unforeseen faults or challenges, 11 12 materials, or any applicable taxes or fees, and a full estimation of work is not 13 possible until the internal workings of the Clock are examined, and 14 WHEREAS, additionally, funds to repair and paint the external Clock 15 structure also fall outside this initial cost estimation, and City staff also identified the 16 need for funds to safely relocate the Clock for the restoration work, and 17 WHEREAS, at the December 13, 2022, Study Session, Council 18 19 Member Rumbaugh shared a Council Consideration Request to authorize the one-20 time use of \$35,000 from the Council Contingency Fund for the restoration of the 21 street clock on Broadway in Downtown Tacoma, and 22 WHEREAS City staff will negotiate and execute an agreement for services, 23 with terms and deliverables for the City's contribution, as well as a financial report 24

provided to the City which shows the source(s) of the funding prior to receiving the
\$35,000 contribution, and



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	WHEREAS RCW 35.34.250 and 35.34.260 authorize a withdrawal from the
1	Council Contingency fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of
2	which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of
3	adopting the budget, and
5	WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less
6	than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now,
7	Therefore,
8	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
9 10	Section 1. That one-time funding in the amount of \$35,000, budgeted from
10	the Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for the purpose of supporting
12	the restoration of the street clock on Broadway in Downtown Tacoma.
13	Section 2. That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to
14	confirm deliverables for the purposes hereinabove enumerated, and document as
15 16	appropriate.
