
2022 Annual Amendment to the Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Regulatory Code:

- Amended Substitute Resolution No. 40985, approving the "Work Plan for South Tacoma Groundwater Protection District Code Amendments", adopted on June 28, 2022
- City Council Direction: The Planning Commission will conduct a public process to develop findings of fact and recommendations as to whether a moratorium on heavy industrial uses and storage of hazardous materials within the South Tacoma Groundwater Protection District is warranted, and if so, to recommend the scope, applicability, and duration for City Council consideration within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution."
- Planning Commission completed review and recommendation on August 17, 2022

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Groundwater Protection District





- Created in 1988 as an overlay zone in Title 13 of the Tacoma Municipal Code.
- Encompasses the South Tacoma aquifer recharge area.
- Created to protect aquifer drinking water from contamination.
- Boundaries expanded east past I-5 in 2006.
- Updated in 2011 to allow stormwater infiltration.
- Applies to businesses/commercial uses


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Coordinating Agencies/Subject Matter Experts

Agency	Roles and Responsibilities
Tacoma Water	Maintains wells that access the south Tacoma aquiferConducts water quality testing and compliance
City's Planning and Development Services	 Permit authority for land use, building code, site development, critical areas Maintains the STGPD regulations SEPA Lead Agency
Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department	Regulates/inspects businesses with hazardous substances on site and infiltration systems meeting certain criteria
City's Environmental Services	 Administers Stormwater Management Program Inspects businesses for source control, pollution prevention, stormwater facilities and environmental compliance
City's Fire Department	 Administers Fire Code pertaining to hazardous materials; emergency response

Prohibited Uses

- · Chemical manufacture and reprocessing.
- Creosote/asphalt manufacture or treatment.
- Electroplating activities.
- Manufacture of Class 1A or 1B flammable liquids.
- Petroleum and petroleum products refinery.
- · Wood products preserving.
- Hazardous waste treatment, storage, or disposal facilities.

Other Standards for storage, stormwater infiltration, spill prevention and inspections.





The Planning Commission Concluded:

- A moratorium is warranted for underground storage tanks (USTs), metal recycling and auto wrecking, vehicle service and repair, and industrial vehicle service and repair.
- Duration: 1 year
- Work Plan: Incorporate into the STGPD Code Amendments for 2023

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IPS Committee Recommendations

The IPS Committee Recommended the following modifications to the Planning Commission proposal:

- Use Categories: Did not find sufficient risk to warrant a moratorium on vehicle service and repair uses
- Expansion of Existing Uses:
 - Found that a moratorium that is too restrictive could have the counter effect of prohibiting improvements that reduce the risks of existing uses.
 - Therefore, the moratorium should allow for reasonable development that improves environmental outcomes and reduces groundwater risks.

Public Hearing – Proposal



Moratorium Proposal for Public Hearing:

- Uses:
 - Moratorium applies to USTs
 - Metal recycling/auto wrecking
- Expansion of Existing Uses: Allow reasonable facility and site improvements that result in reduced risks to groundwater resources
- Duration of Moratorium: Up to 1 year
- Work Plan: Incorporate into the STGPD Code Amendments
