Joint City Council / Tacoma Public Utility Board Briefing Item

1. <u>22-1263</u> Legislative Agendas and Policies Update

At approximately 12:03 p.m., Rosa McLeod, Government Relations Analyst, City Manager's Office, provided opening remarks and an agenda on the Citywide state and federal priority agendas and policies; and introduced Clark Mather, Community and Government Relations Manager, and Logan Bahr, State Relations Manager, Tacoma Public Utilities (TPU). She continued by presenting the 2023 General Government (GG) state priorities, including affordable housing, permanent supportive housing, and shelter; the Northwest Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Processing Center; behavioral health system and vulnerable populations; police transparency and public safety; transportation improvements and preservation; climate action; Cheney Stadium improvements; funding for the South Tacoma Fire Station No. 7 replacement; equitable fiscal structure; and renovating the downtown library's Main Branch.

Bahr presented the 2023 TPU state priorities, including priorities related to TPU overall; and specific priorities related to Tacoma Water, Tacoma Rail, and Tacoma Power.

McLeod presented the 2023 GG federal priorities, including a summary of the 117th United States Congress; and priorities related to affordable housing and homelessness, policing and criminal justice systems transformation, human dignity and public safety, economic security, civil rights, telecommunications, and implementation of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and Inflation Reduction Act.

Mather presented the 2023 TPU federal priorities, including priorities related to TPU overall, and specific priorities related to Tacoma Water, Tacoma Rail, and Tacoma Power; and next steps, noting adopting the Citywide priorities, and upcoming federal and state legislative sessions.

Discussion ensued regarding encampments in the right-of-way, advocating for home ownership, library capital improvements, the Howard A Hanson Dam, a proposed federal electric bicycle rebate program, Northwest ICE Processing Center detainees and their rights, the benefits of collaboration between GG and TPU departments, statutes related to possession of illicit substances, Fire Station No. 7 in South Tacoma, civil rights, federal legislation related to abortion, adding the number of beds needed for behavioral health, equity in the cannabis industry and the Community Reinvestment Act, statewide

middle housing policies and the Home in Tacoma Project, appreciation for TPU Director Jackie Flowers and City Manager Elizabeth Pauli, support for an extreme weather policy, improving accessibility for transit and transportation, and policy questions for staff to follow up on.

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The joint study session concluded at 1:00 p.m.

2. <u>22-1264</u> Council Consideration Request - Business License Fees and Business Engagement at the Economic Development Committee

Presiding Officer Blocker presented a Council Consideration Request on behalf of Mayor Woodards for a resolution directing the City Manager to support the Economic Development Committee in reviewing and suggesting recommendations on how the City can improve communications and better support local businesses. He concluded by stating the proposed resolution will be on the November 22, 2022, meeting agenda for consideration.

Discussion ensued regarding the suggestion to include a business climate survey in the process, support for the local business community, and equity.
