Subject: Fiscal Impact of AFSCME Local 120 General Wage Increase – Graphics Art Specialist Lead

Overview

This memorandum provides a financial analysis for a wage increase for a new Graphics Art Specialist Lead classification within the AFSCME Local 120 General bargaining unit for the years 2013-2016.

Financial Impact

A new Graphics Art Specialist Lead classification has been negotiated which will affect one position within the bargaining unit (position 50001958). The position will receive retroactive wage increases as follows:

- Effective January 1, 2013 the top step of the classification will be \$29.82/hour.
- Effective May 1, 2013 wages shall increase by 2.0%.
- Effective January 1, 2014 wages shall increase by 1.2%.
- Effective January 1, 2015 wages shall increase by 1.5%.
- Effective January 1, 2016 wages shall increase by 2.0%.
