 - City of Tacoma to undertake a visioning process
- January 7, 2014
 - Council Consideration Request (CCR)
 - Initiate an RFP Process for a long-term visioning effort
 - Open, transparent and inclusive process for all Tacoma residents and stakeholders
 - Guide decision making and resource allocation
 - Include City staff and external/partner agency participation
 - Performance tracking and reporting for progress
- April 1, 2014
 - Contract awarded to BDS Planning & Urban Design

- Increase assessed value and decrease vacancy rate of downtown property

- Increase the percentage of streets in good or excellent condition
