Subject:	Fiscal Impact of Teamsters Local Union No. 117 General Unit Wage Increase for 2015-2018

Overview

A Tentative Agreement between the City of Tacoma and the Teamsters Local Union No. 117 General Unit (117 General) has been reached for a new successor collective bargaining agreement for the years 2015-2018.

Financial Impact

Effective January 1, 2015 all wage rates for 117 General classifications shall be increased by 2%; except the classification Solid Waste Worker (CSC 06270) which will receive a selective wage adjustment of 5%.

Effective January 1, 2016 all wage rates for 117 General classifications shall be increased by 1.1%.

Additionally, effective July 1, 2016 the wage rates for Carpenter (CSC 52010) and Painter Industrial (CSC 52050) classifications shall be increased by 1.5% and wage rates for Crime Analyst (CSC 11010) and Senior Crime Analyst (CSC 11020) shall be increased by 2%.

Effective January 1, 2017 wage rates for all classifications shall be increased by 2%.

Effective January 1, 2018 wage rates for all classifications shall be increased by 2.5%.
