Call to Order

Briefing Items

2016 Annual Amendment to the Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Regulatory Code Public Hearing Debriefing

Council Member Ibsen arrived here, at 12:06 a.m.

At approximately 12:07 p.m., Brian Boudet, Planning and Development Services (PDS), provided brief opening remarks and introduced Stephen Atkinson, PDS.

Council Member Woodards arrived here, at 12:08 p.m.

Mr. Atkinson discussed public comment received relative to the proposed Annual Amendment to the Comprehensive Plan and Land Use Regulatory Code.

Council Member Thoms arrived here, at 12:19 p.m.

Mr. Atkinson continued discussing recommendations and next steps. Discussion ensued throughout regarding minimum lot sizes, development of South 72nd and South Alaska streets, notification requirements and improvements and shoreline regulations. Council Member Thoms requested a map overlay showing the proposed size of a notification area.

Committee Reports

Deputy Mayor Mello stated that Pierce Transit had recently moved forward with improvements to Transit Centers in many neighborhoods, including 72nd and Portland Avenue, Tacoma Community College, the Park and Rides located near State Route 512, and the Tacoma Mall. He stated that Pierce Transit will be investing \$2,500,000 for basic improvements, such as cracked pavement, shelters, upgraded lighting and landscaping.

Council Member Lonergan stated that in light of the Latino Town Hall findings, he had reached out to South Sound 911 regarding language services offered by emergency operators and stated that South Sound 911 uses a service called Language Line, which allows for an immediate connection directly to a translator, and that other spanish speaking communications officers can be reached as well. Discussion ensued regarding financial incentive for bilingual emergency operators.
