STUDY SESSION/WORK SESSION

3. The City Council Study Session/Budget Work Session of Tuesday, October 25, 2016, will be held at Noon, in the City Council Chambers of the Tacoma Municipal Building. Discussion items will include: (1) General Fund Revenues and Cost Drivers Presentation; (2) Tacoma Police Presentation; (3) Tacoma Fire Presentation; (4) Council Consideration Request — Third Party Consultant for Click! Analysis and Audit; (5) Other Items of Interest; (6) Committee Reports; (7) Agenda Review and City Manager's Weekly Report; and, (8) Executive Session — Potential Litigation.

At Tuesday' Study Session, there will be a City Council Budget Work Session where the General Fund Revenues and Cost Drivers of the 2017-2018 Biennial Budget will be presented. Tacoma Police and Tacoma Fire will also be presenting their budgets.

In addition at Tuesday's Study Session, Council Member McCarthy will share a Council Consideration Request for a resolution directing the City Manager to hire a third party consultant to audit, analyze, and establish a reasonable methodology for cost allocation between Tacoma Power and Click!, and to evaluate the expansion of the Click! Network in the context of an evolving telecommunications and cable industry. This proposed process would take into account the past and present benefits of Click! to Tacoma Power, as well as the future prospective benefits that could be derived from improvements to the Click! Network.

COUNCIL REQUESTS/INQUIRIES

5. During public comment on an agenda item at the October 4th City Council meeting regarding the granting of a multi-family tax exemption for a development project, Mr. Roy Kissler provided **comments to the City Council regarding the time it currently takes to obtain permits from Planning and Development Services** (PDS). In response, PDS Director Peter Huffman provides the following information.

Mr. Kissler is responsible for a large quantity of residential development in Tacoma, primarily on the eastside and southend of Tacoma. Over the last several years, Planning and Development Service (PDS) has tracked the average level of service related to Mr. Kissler's permits. This level of service is captured in two metrics, the first is "days to review" which constitutes only the days the permit was in the permitting system for review. The second metric, "total days" includes the time PDS was waiting for additional information and/or the number of days between the permit being ready to issue and the date it was picked up by Mr. Kissler. Utilizing these metrics, Mr. Kissler's permit timeframes range from as few as 19 "days in review" to as many as 134 "total days" depending on the size, scale and type of residential development permit submitted.

As mentioned by Peter during the PDS 2017-2018 budget presentation on Tuesday, October 11th, PDS will continue to implement several initiatives aimed at improving service delivery and the Department's levels of service to better meet the needs of permitting customers. Specific improvements include modification to the permit review production model, further enhancements to preapplication services and the continued leveraging of the City's investment in the Accela permitting software package. The Master Builders Association along with vested stakeholders and permit customers, such as Mr. Kissler, will be involved in the design and implementation of these initiatives. The following item will be scheduled on the agenda of the earliest available Study Session:

We respectfully ask for City Council consideration of a resolution directing the City Manager to hire third party consultant(s) to audit, analyze, and establish a reasonable methodology for cost allocation between Tacoma Power and Click, and to evaluate the expansion of the Click! network in the context of an evolving telecommunications and cable industry. This process will take into account the past and present benefits of Click to Tacoma Power, as well as the future prospective benefits that could be derived from improvements to the Click! network.

BRIEF BACKGROUND:


On December 15, 2015, the City Council approved Resolution 39347 which required Tacoma Power to develop a business, financial and marketing plan to provide Click customers with retail cable television, voice, and internet services. Following a nine-month review by the Click Engagement committee, the committee recommended approval of its 'All-In Compete Business Plan' ("Plan"). On September 28, 2016, the Tacoma Public Utility Board approved Resolution No. U-10879, wherein the Board approved the Plan. The Resolution and Plan rely upon Tacoma Power's most recent O&M cost allocation scheme and further requires an additional contribution of six to ten million dollars per year from "electric revenues" to Click. Per the Resolution, these monies will be used to "appropriately compensate Power's past, current and future beneficial uses of the telecommunications system infrastructure..."

Since its inception, in 1996, Click has been a part of Tacoma Powers' telecommunications system. Click was initially financed with Tacoma Power electric revenues. Since that time, the internal cost allocation between Click and Tacoma Power has changed significantly. Over time, Tacoma Power has substantially increased the cost allocation borne by Click. The most recent shift in the cost allocation is supported by an accountant assessment which relies predominantly upon the cost-accounting recommendations of Tacoma Power. This dramatic change in cost allocation spurred scrutiny as to the financial viability and prospective legality of Click, and has been the key driver underlying the debate over the future of Click. It has also encouraged considerable public scrutiny as to the veracity and appropriateness of the current accounting assumptions and methodology implemented by Tacoma Power. Ultimately, we feel that the concerns raised about the current cost allocation methodology and the implications of said methodology on the proposed Plan are significant and must be resolved prior to making a final decision on the Plan.

Therefore, in order to provide the City Council with the best analysis and information available in its deliberations on the proposed Plan, and further in order to encourage the public's confidence in the process and the underlying assumptions of the Plan, we respectfully ask for City Council consideration of a resolution directing the City Manager to hire third party consultant(s) to audit, analyze, and establish independent reasonable methodology for cost allocation between Tacoma Power and Click, and to evaluate the expansion of the Click! network in the context of an evolving telecommunications and cable industry, as well as the future prospective benefits that could be derived from improvements to the Click! network.
