Dear Mayor and Council Members:

ACTION REQUESTED

1. Please note you are invited to the **Mayor's State of the City** "Educate.Connect.Prosper" event on Wednesday, February 8th, 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., at the Hotel Murano, located at 1320 Broadway.

ITEMS OF INTEREST

- 2. Staff from the City Manager's Office, Office of Equity and Human Rights (OEHR), and the Media and Communications Office has convened an initial working group to move forward the convening of Immigrants, Refugees, and advocates as directed in Resolution 39642. Staff has decided to hold a preconvening in mid-February comprised of community partners who are subject matter experts to assist in the development of the convening relating to the size of the task force, venue for convening, intended populations, service concepts, and setting realistic expectations regarding scope and resources.
 - OEHR is leading this effort to ensure that the convening is culturally sensitive to the needs of our immigrant and refugee communities. The Media and Communications Office is developing an outreach and communications plan that will be guided by input from the pre-convening group on the best avenues for disseminating information about the convening event. Staff anticipates conducting study sessions for guidance from Council both before the full convening to present our plan, and after the convening to report-out and obtain next steps. Other developments will be included in the City Manager's Weekly Report on an as-needed basis.
- 3. Peter Huffman, Director of the Planning and Development Services (PDS), shares the following two announcements:
 - Council Members and citizens are invited to attend the first event of the Planning and Development Services Public Forum series on Monday, February 13, 2017, 6:00-8:00 p.m., at Downing Elementary School, located at 2502 North Orchard Street. These monthly forums will provide an orientation about how the planning and development process works,

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what information is used, how decisions are made, what opportunities the public has to comment and participate, and how the City assesses and manages the ongoing impacts from growth and development (additional information at www.cityoftacoma.org/PDSForums).

COUNCIL REQUESTS/INQUIRIES

7. Based on a weekly project update received today from Evette Mason, Port of Tacoma Government Affairs Manager, the progress on the pile driving project for the dock/crane construction project has slowed. This means that the noise variance granted by the City through February 15th, which coincides with the Washington Fish and Wildlife "fish window", may expire prior to completion of the project. In granting the original variance, the City went above and beyond the call of duty to cooperate on a critical project that benefits the Port's contractor as they expand and upgrade facilities to the benefit of the Port/community. That said, insufficient project planning, timing, resources, and equipment failures are not valid reasons for the City to do anything more to assist. Based on community complaints to City Hall and input from Deputy Mayor Thoms (District 2) and other Council Members, I will be directing staff to deny any noise variance request of the contractor for further extended hours operation. Should the contractor receive authorization to continue working beyond February 15th, by Fish and Wildlife based on the actual commencing of this year's spawning run, the contractor will be limited to working within currently legislated work hours in compliance with our existing noise ordinance regulations.
