REPORTS BY THE CITY MANAGER

Mark Lauzier, Acting City Manager, stated a public memorial service for Patrol Officer Reginald "Jake" Gutierrez will be held on December 9, 2016 at 1:00 p.m. at the Tacoma Dome, and the funeral procession will begin at 10:30 a.m. and travel from Joint Base Lewis-McChord to the Tacoma Dome. He provided information on grief counseling available at the Lighthouse Center. Mr. Lauzier then reported on a Washington State Transportation Improvement Board grant in the amount of \$1,413,179 that was awarded to the South 38th Streetscape Project in the Lincoln Business District, noting this grant brings the total funding on the project to just over \$9 million. He then presented preliminary concepts for Phase 2 of the project.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee

Deputy Mayor Mello, Chair of the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, reported on the meeting of November 9, 2016, stating the Committee heard a presentation by Environmental Services and the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department on the Pharmaceutical Take Back Program, followed by an update on Tacoma Bike Share Month. He stated the November 23, 2016 meeting was cancelled and the next meeting will be on December 14, 2016, at 4:30 p.m., to conduct interviews for the Landmarks Preservation Commission and hear updates on the Mobility Master Plan and the City's Commute Trip Reduction Program.

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Council Member Campbell thanked the Police Department for its professionalism this past week. He stated Officer Jake Gutierrez was a great man and an exemplary officer, was well known and liked on the Eastside, and provided his thanks and sympathies.
