2016 MOU Background

- 32 Metro area agencies use Tacoma 800 MHz system
- 25 Pierce County rural agencies use CCN 700 MHz system
- Tacoma fees based on: infrastructure cost; dispatch console support cost; number of devices
 - \$35.65/month per radio (non-dispatched)
 - \$45.52/month per radio (dispatched)
- MOU provided temporary fee offsets for SS911 agencies
 - Three-party (SS911, Tacoma, CCN)
 - Fees capped at \$30/month per radio
 - SS911 paid Tacoma \$445,859 for fee offset
 - SS911 paid CCN \$1,850,029 for fee offset
- MOU expired December 31, 2016

2017 MOU Highlights

- Tacoma fees unchanged from 2016
- Two-party agreements:
 - Tacoma/SS911 and CCN/SS911
 - Fees capped at \$31.50/month per radio
 - SS911 pays Tacoma \$413,702 for fee offset
 - SS911 pays CCN \$1,843,590 for fee offset
 - Pierce County contributes approx. \$1.25M to SS911
 - MOU expires December 31, 2017
- Additional Tacoma/SS911 provisions
 - Tacoma enables "automatic roaming" with 700 MHz system
 - Parties collaborate on long-term radio system strategic plan
 - Parties collaborate on Tacoma Fire dispatch study

ITD Recommendation

- ITD recommends entering into MOU agreement
- ITD seeks GPFC endorsement of MOU to Council
- Council consideration on April 18, 2017
