1	BY REQUEST OF MAYOR STRICKLAND AND COUNCIL MEMBERS CAMPBELL AND IBSEN
2	A RESOLUTION authorizing the use of up to \$50,000, budgeted from the City
3	Council Contingency Fund, for the purpose of developing an anchor institutions strategy to complete a comprehensive study to align current
4	planning efforts, identify gaps and achieve Tacoma 2025 related goals; and directing the Interim City Manager to execute a professional services
5	agreement for a third-party consultant outlining the scope of work and deliverables.
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7	WHEREAS the City is home to many thriving and innovative anchor
8	institutions with the ability to leverage their unique resources and create
9	relationships to support community and economic development goals, and
10	WHEREAS anchor institutions are defined as non-profit organizations that,
11	once established, tend not to move location because of their large physical
12	footprints and history, and
13	WHEREAS these institutions have a major economic impact in their cities
14	due to their roles as employers, large purchasers of goods and services, and as
15	real estate, business, and human capital developers, and
16	WHEREAS, with this recognition, leaders across the country have put a
17	greater focus on the role and influence of these institutions to stimulate local
18	economies and strengthen the competiveness of their cities, and
19	WHEREAS the City's anchor institutions include the University of
20	Washington Tacoma, University of Puget Sound, Tacoma Community College,
21	Bates Technical College, Tacoma Public Schools, CHI Franciscan, Multicare, and
22	the City of Tacoma, and
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WHEREAS a formalized anchor institution initiative will align with the
priorities identified in Tacoma 2025, including Livability, Economy and Workforce,
Civic Engagement, Education and Equity and Accessibility, and will provide
opportunities to form public-private partnerships, test strategies, and measure
outcomes, and

5 WHEREAS development of an anchor institutions initiative will allow for 6 long-term partnerships and commitments that will help the City move strategies 7 forward, and the development of public-private partnerships to address many of 8 the priorities identified in the original Tacoma 2025 vision document, and 9 WHEREAS, at the December 6, 2016, Study Session, a Council 10 Consideration Request ("CCR") was shared, requesting the City Council to 11 formalize the City's commitment to implement an anchor institutions strategy in 12 partnership with anchor institutions, and

13 WHEREAS, at the April 11, 2017, Study Session, Council Member Ibsen 14 shared a follow-up CCR, directing the Interim City Manager to allocate funding in 15 the amount of up to \$50,000, budgeted from the City Council Contingency Fund, to 16 hire a third-party consultant to assist with the development of a targeted strategy 17 for the anchor institutions initiative, to include completing a comprehensive study to 18 align current planning efforts, identify gaps, and outline opportunities to address 19 the strategies outlined in Tacoma 2025; and to direct the Interim City Manager to 20 negotiate a professional services agreement that outline the scope of work and 21 deliverables for said funding, and

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	WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less
1	than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now,
2	Therefore,
3	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
4	Section 1. That one-time funding in the amount of up to \$50,000, budgeted
5	from the City Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for the purpose of
6	developing an anchor institutions strategy to complete a comprehensive study to
7	align current planning efforts, identify gaps, and achieve Tacoma 2025 related
8	goals.
9	Section 2. That the Interim City Manager is hereby directed to negotiate and
10	execute a professional services agreement for a third-party consultant, outlining the
11	scope of work and deliverables for the services described in Section 1.
