Background

- Master Interlocal Agreement
 - Established new baseline for COT support funding and parks maint. levels of service
 - Established working partnership and policy governance expectations via PPG & ICC
 - Committed both entities to cooperatively develop recommendations for a capital reserve fund
 - Incorporated the concept of future
 Administrative Amendments via updates to
 Exhibits via MOUs, when appropriate

- Master ILA = Cooperative Relationship
 - 3, Quarterly ICC and 1, PPG meetings
- Defined ongoing work groups and developed master Work Plan
- Cooperative relationships yielded:
 - 2017-18 Budget Policy Actions (2 examples)
 - Expanded or improved public facilities or services through public and public/private partnerships (2 examples)

 Budgeted remaining \$3 million for Eastside Community Center in 2017-18 budget (total City funding of \$5 million)



Ruston Way conceptual planning for \$200,000 (shared 50/50)
