## 1. General Factors:

- a. Tacoma has no sister-cities in Ukraine,
- b. Brovary Ukraine is a sister city to Rockford, Illinois
- c. **Demographic similarities:** Ukraine is a diverse country with many ethnic backgrounds: Ukrainians, Russians, Belorussians, Moldovian, Crimean Tatar, Bulgarians, Hungarians, Romanians, Poles, Jews, Gypsy. Brovary's over 100, 000 population is made up of the previously stated ethnicities.
- d. Geographic, economic and environmental similarities: the city of Brovary is characterized by great geographical location with access to natural resources, economic advantages, and access to main national and international highways including railroads. Brovary just like Tacoma, is located near a waterway the Dniper River which gives economic advantages to businesses. Brovary has many parks and is located in mixed forests. It borders Kyiv, the capital of Ukraine similar to how Tacoma borders Seattle, a major metropolitan area. Brovary is home to a railway station, broadcasting center, and various industries and factories such as knitting, woodworking, machine tools, plastic materials, and a large Coca Cola company plant. It is a shoe making capital and a sport center; multiple athletes with Olympic standing have attended athletic school in Brovary (Oleksandra Kononova, Vladimir and Vitalii Klichko, Aleksandr Bagach, Andrey Kalashnikov, Zhanna Pintusevich, Oleg Lisogor, Viktor Kuznetsov). The city has both music and art schools. It is divided into old historic town and new more industrious section.
- e. The mayor of Brovary, Igor Sapozhko, is the person of official contact. *His contact information is:* info@brovary-rada.gov.us, +380 45 945 40 94, + 380 670 884 17 91.
- f. Currently Tacoma has no sister cities in Ukraine. Adding Brovary to the list of Tacoma's sister cities will add to the ethnic diversity. Brovary will be the only eastern European sister city Tacoma has officially approved *and 3rd* European city for city of Tacoma.
- g. Sister Cities: Brovary has 4 sister cities in France, Russia, Belarus, and Rockford United States.

- h. **Ukrainian Population:** Tacoma has a large Ukrainian population approximately 3% of the population has *immigrated* from Ukraine or of Ukrainian descent.
- i. There are thousands of Ukrainian born immigrants living in Tacoma and suburbs. As a rule, all immigrants keep their language and teach their children. For translating and interpreting any members of the sister city team can help with interpreting or point to the right source. Most Ukrainians learn English in schools.

# j. Types of exchanges:

- a. Economic Exchange: Brovary is rich with lumber resources and factories exchange in ideas and business partnership may benefit both cities. Shoe making is a large business in Brovary with brand name factories, this may serve as an export opportunity. Brovary has patented construction methods that could enhance construction methods in Tacoma. Tacoma in turn can serve as a community that will support further investments into Brovary real estate and businesses.
- b. **Tourism:** Brovary is located within 7km from the capital of Ukraine Kyiv. There are many tourist attractions in Brovary: Water Park, Peremohy Park, Shevchenko Park and WWII museum; all Kyyiv attractions are within an hour drive from Brovary. It is a great place to lodge for cheaper prices while visiting the capital.
- c. **Education:** most Ukrainians learn English from primary school. It would benefit both cities to host a student exchange program. Brovary is an athletic center of Ukraine, it boasts multiple Olympic level athletes an exchange between athletes and sport teams may benefit both cities.

# 2. Cultural, Civic, Economic and Educational Factors

- a. **Cultural Institutions:** Brovary boasts multiple cultural institutions of interest for Tacoma and its residents: City library, children's' library, educational complexes, outdoor school, sports clubs, performing arts school, music school, city museum, WWII museum, cultural center, city club, 3 theaters, open air theater, water park. Because of its proximity to Kiev, all cultural institutions in Kiev are within less than 1 hr. drive.
- b. Civic Organizations: The civic organizations that are present in the city are: children's clubs, city choir for adults, children's choir, football league, performing arts club, choreography, gymnastics and ballroom dance clubs; vocal clubs, folk music/instrument/dance club. Outside of school clubs for kids and youth focusing on: arts, vocal, theater, handmade arts. Over 20 English clubs, orchestra, theater with English language, sports centers and Cossaks club (ethnic Ukrainian Warriors). Club for seniors, folk ensemble "Fate", dance club for war veterans, and literary clubs.
- c. **Formal Communication:** The communication systems that are present in Brovary are: radio stations, newspapers, broadcasting center for long and short waves. The city publishes 4 newspapers among them: "Brovarskiy Revizor", "Pravda Tut"; multiple online news sites and social media. - d. **Amateur/Professional Sports:** Brovary is hometown of talented Olympic and world champions. It has become an important sports center: it has soccer club: FC Nafkom Brovary, Sports center "Kypava" and "Body Flex", boxing ring, stadium, rehab center pool,

- physical therapy (for community members and soldiers fighting in East Ukraine ATO) 25% of Brovary population is involved in various areas of sport. It has a youth sports school.
- e. **Educational Institutions:** 24 preschools, 6 schools, 2 specialized schools focusing on foreign languages and humanities. College, private school "Fortune" and a secondary evening school.
- f. **Hospitals and health facilities:** Brovary has a regional hospital with ambulance services; it includes a diagnostics center and children's hospital.
- g. Language: Most Ukrainians speak Russian language which is taught in some Tacoma Public Schools. Most Slavic churches offer evening or weekend Russian/Ukrainian language classes to children.
- h. **English Language:** all schools and most preschools teach English language.

- 1. Planning meetings took place in November 2016. Two members of Formation Committee visited Mayor in Bravory and exchanged ideas about forming a Sister City.


