COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Community Vitality and Safety Committee

Council Member Campbell, Vice Chair of the Community Vitality and Safety Committee stated the meetings on July 13 and 27, 2017, were cancelled. He reported at the meeting on August 10, 2017, the Tacoma Fire Department gave their mid-year review and updated the Committee on the aid vehicle implementation, and there was a policy discussion about the creation of an Immigrant Defense Fund. Council Member Campbell concluded by stating the next meeting is scheduled for August 24, 2017, at 4:30 p.m. in Tacoma Municipal Building Room 248, to conduct interviews for the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority and the Tacoma Area Commission on Disabilities, and hear an update on the Neighborhood Council Program.

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Mayor Strickland stated she is signing on to the Mayors' Compact to Combat Hate with the U.S. Conference of Mayors to combat hate, extremism and bigotry, noting the horrific events in Charlottesville. She stated there are also hate groups in Washington State and some in Pierce County.

She read the ten key components of this initiative:

- 1. Expressly rejecting extremism, white supremacy and all forms of bigotry
- 2. Denouncing all acts of hate wherever they occur
- 3. Ensuring public safety while protecting free speech and other basic constitutional rights
- 4. Calling for fully-resourced law enforcement and civil rights investigations of domestic terrorism and hate crimes
- 5. Elevating and prioritizing anti-bias and anti-hate programs in our nation's schools
- 6. Supporting targeted communities and bringing together civic and community leaders to build trust
- 7. Celebrating diversity, promoting inclusivity and challenging bias
- 8. Promoting law enforcement training on responding to and reporting hate incidents, hate crimes and domestic terrorism
- 9. Encouraging residents in their communities to report hate incidents and crimes, including using hot lines and online tools
- 10. Maintaining civil rights enforcement and strengthening hate crime laws when necessary

Mayor Strickland stated the City of Tacoma has taken on equity, empowerment, and inclusion as part of our core values and she will continue to work with staff and the community to build a community that is inclusive and treats all people with respect and dignity.

Council Member Walker Lee stated she was discouraged by the events in Charlottesville and the comments made thereafter. She noted she runs a civil rights agency that deals with issues of discrimination and housing on a regular basis. She stated she has been encouraged by the work of the City of Tacoma, citing the equity and empowerment initiative, Project PEACE, the Office of Equity and Human Rights, the Immigrant and Refugee Task Force, and the Latino Town Hall Task Force. She then invited everyone to attend an event on Friday, August 18, 2017, Cracking the Codes: The System of Racial Inequity. She stated the event is a film screening and community conversation led by Dr. Shakti Butler, at Evergreen State College in Tacoma, from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.
