About the Project

 Develop conceptual designs for improvements to Puyallup Avenue from S. C Street to Portland Avenue

- Utilize the entire ROW for multimodal uses/complete street concepts
- Enhance the experience for everyone, including pedestrians, cyclists, drivers, transit riders and freight operators
- Achieve subarea plan goals
- Make Puyallup Avenue an inviting space where people want to visit



- Parking is increasingly an issue

- Doesn't currently feel like a safe street to bike

- Acts as a gateway for people arriving in Tacoma by transit or for events




Puyallup Avenue – Existing Conditions

Puyallup Avenue between E. D St and E. E St facing East Existing




Alternative 1: Bike Path, Transit/HOV Lane, 2 General <u>Purpose Lanes + Center Turn Lane</u>

Puyallup Avenue between E. D St and E. E St facing East Alternative 1




Alternative 2: Protected Bike Lane with 4 General Purpose Lanes



Open House Summary

- Alt. 1 generally preferred, but support provided for:
 - Protected bike lanes (Alt. 2)
 - Parking management/reduced on-street parking (Alt. 2)
 - Wide sidewalks/separation from traffic (Alt. 3)
- Concerns: Reduced lanes/turning queues, landscaping maintenance, ped/bike-friendly protective environment
- Hybrid alternative developed (Alt 4)





Hybrid Alternative 4




Puyallup Avenue between Pacific Ave and A St facing East
