#### OVERVIEW



- Local funding and phasing memorandum of understanding with WSDOT includes a commitment of match funds for two project grants:
  - \$500,000 for 70<sup>th</sup> Avenue East project in Fife
  - \$1.5 million for Port of Tacoma Spur

#### \*\*\*BACKGROUND





- The Puget Sound Gateway Program was funded by the Legislature in 2015 with a local funding match needed of \$130 million
- The City of Tacoma has been working with WSDOT to develop an MOU that is based on leveraging City funds as matches for grant applications
- Without the local funding match of \$130 million, WSDOT will not have a fully funded project

#### Legislative Direction



- Puget Sound Gateway is a single project and its components should be pursued on the same timeline.
- An MOU is required by July 1, 2018 to outline the commitment of local nexus project recipients.
- Project savings will be kept within the Puget Sound Gateway corridor.

- Fife Interurban Trail -- Capital Budget
- Fife 70<sup>th</sup> Avenue E Bottleneck -- FMSIB
- Kent Veterans Drive West Corridor Completion --PSRC
- SeaTac Access (SR 509 Stage 1) -- PSRC
- Port of Tacoma Spur, I-5/SR 167 to SR 509 --PSRC
- Puget Sound Gateway -- INFRA Grant

#### Fife 70th Avenue E Bottleneck



- Replaces current two-lane 70<sup>th</sup> Avenue Bridge with new four-lane bridge
- Relieves major freight bottlenecks
- Accommodates construction of the new I-5/SR 167 interchange
- First project to go to construction

# Port of Tacoma Spur, I-5/SR 167 to SR 509



- Provides new and direct access from warehousing districts to the Port of Tacoma
- Creates redundancy to I-5 and improves the movement of freight and goods in the region
- Enhances access to the City of Tacoma from points east and north
