STUDY SESSION/WORK SESSION

 The City Council Study Session of Tuesday, May 1, 2018, will be held in Room 16 of the Tacoma Municipal Building North, at Noon. Discussion items will include: (1) Tacoma Mall Neighborhood Subarea Plan; (2) Asset Management Presentation; (3) Small Cell/5G Facilities in the City's Right-of-Way; (4) Other Items of Interest; (5) Committee Reports; and, (6) Agenda Review and City Manager's Weekly Report.

As a follow up to the Tacoma Mall Neighborhood Subarea Plan Public Hearing, on April 24th, the City Council_will continue its discussion of the Plan package, as recommended by the Planning Commission and the Infrastructure,

Planning and Sustainability Committee. The Public Hearing provided oral and written comments on issues including the following:

- Inclusionary zoning proposal
- Parking requirements
- Green streets standards
- Madison School future development
- Front doors facing alleys
- Clarifications regarding maps in the Plan
- Plan implementation steps

During the discussion, staff will provide analysis and, if appropriate, policy alternatives related to these topics to facilitate Council's consideration of any amendments for introduction during first reading of the adopting Ordinance. As a second item on the Study Session agenda, Office of Management and Budget and Public Works staff will provide a **high-level overview of the state of General Government assets**, including discussion of best practices and anticipated needs in the 2019-2020 biennium.

In addition at Tuesday's Study Session, Planning and Development Services will share the proposed code changes for development standards related to the installation of Small Cell/5G facilities in the City's right-of-way. The standards include limitations on height, bulk, color, as well as other standards that will minimize aesthetic impacts.
