The Tacoma City Council passed Resolution No. 40046 concerning Tacoma Creates to support arts, culture, science, and heritage programs.

As proposed, Tacoma Creates includes arts, culture, science and heritage programs for youth after school and during summer. Tacoma Creates also offers residents free and discounted access to cultural activities, programs for every neighborhood and age, and expanded services to diverse, underserved and low-income populations. Funding Tacoma Creates is a sales tax increase of one-tenth of one percent, expiring in seven years, beginning January 1, 2019. An average Tacoma household will pay \$13 per year.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Economic Development Committee

Council Member McCarthy, Chair of the Economic Development Committee, reported at the meeting on May 29, 2018, the Tacoma Mall representatives provided information on the upcoming redevelopment plans for the Tacoma Mall. At the June 12, 2018 meeting, the Committee heard from the South Sound Military and Communities Partnership and Joint Base Lewis-McChord (JBLM) staff on the JBLM regional impact analysis study. He then stated Workforce Central and industrial business owners presented on advanced manufacturing industry landscape and Workforce development. He concluded by stating the next meeting will be on Tuesday, July 10, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. in Conference Room 248, and will include a discussion on advanced manufacturing at Clover Park Technical College and an update on the Port of Tacoma and Northwest Seaport Alliance.

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Council Member Camarata invited the community to Art on the Avenue event on Sunday, July 8, 2018, which is an annual music and art festival hosted by the 6th Avenue District, along 6th Avenue from State Street to Alder Street. In its 18th year and attracting thousands of patrons, it is Tacoma's largest arts-based yearly event. He stated this event will be utilizing the Great Barrier Relief Fund, which came from the City Council Contingency Fund, and that he will be one of the judges on "Grub Crawl".
