Funding traffic control devices for the McKinley Hill Street Fair

ITEM/ISSUE PROPOSED FOR COUNCIL CONSIDERATION:

I ask for your support for the inclusion of the following item on the agenda at the earliest available meeting of the Study Session:

I respectfully request City Council concurrence to direct the City Manager to allocate \$500 from the City Council Contingency Fund for costs associated with traffic control devices at the 2018 McKinley Hill Street Fair.

BRIEF BACKGROUND:

When a Special Event produced by our community partners requires a street closure, the City issued Special Event Permit dictates the number of traffic control devices required via an approved Traffic Control Plan. The event producers are responsible for acquiring barriers and the associated costs.

On June 5, at the request of the Cross District Association (CDA), the Tacoma City Council passed resolution number 40025, a resolution authorizing the use of City Council contingency funds for traffic control devices for the Neighborhood Business Districts Special Events Program Pilot. The CDA requested this pilot provide funds to assist with five events organized by Neighborhood Business District Associations that are members of the CDA.

The McKinley Hill Street Fair is an annual, successful community event in east Tacoma. It requires a Special Event Permit that dictates the number of traffic control devices required for its approved Traffic Control Plan. This event is organized by the Tacoma Christian Center Church in partnership with the Eastside Neighborhood Council of Tacoma. While the street fair takes place in the McKinley Business District, this district does not have an active association and is not a member of the CDA, leading to the McKinley Hill Street Fair not being included in the Neighborhood Districts Special Events Program Pilot. In lieu of an active business association, neighborhood groups have filled the role of planning the business district street fair that will spur community and economic development, and have identified a need for financial assistance for traffic control devices.

The estimated cost of traffic control devices for the McKinley Hill Street Fair is \$500, to be split between the Tacoma Christian Center Church and the Eastside Neighborhood Council of Tacoma.
