1	BY REQUEST OF COUNCIL MEMBERS BEALE, HUNTER, AND USHKA
2	A RESOLUTION authorizing the use of City Council Contingency Funds, in an
3	amount up to \$500, for expenses related to traffic control devices for the McKinley Hill Street Fair; and directing the City Manager to negotiate and
4	execute an agreement outlining the scope of work and deliverables for the funding.

6	WHEREAS, whenever a special event produced by our community partners
7	to promote their Neighborhood Business District requires a street closure, the
8	City-issued Special Event Permit dictates the number of traffic control devices
9	required pursuant to an approved traffic control plan, and
10 11	WHEREAS, currently, Neighborhood Business Districts are responsible for
12	acquiring traffic barriers and associated costs for these events, which range from
13	\$2,000 to \$6,000 per event, and
14	WHEREAS, because of the economic and community development benefits
15	of these events, it is in the best interests of the City to provide financial assistance
16 17	for the rental of traffic control devices for key events so the events can continue to
17	take place, and
19	WHEREAS, on June 5, 2018, at the request of the Cross District
20	Association ("CDA"), the City Council adopted Resolution No. 40025, authorizing
21	the use of City Council Contingency Funds for traffic control devices for the
22	the use of City Council Contingency Funds for traine control devices for the
23	Neighborhood Business Districts Special Events Program Pilot ("Program Pilot"), to
24	provide funding to assist with five events organized by Neighborhood Business
25	District Associations that are members of the CDA, and
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WHEREAS the McKinley Hill Street Fair is an annual, successful community 1 event in east Tacoma, organized by the Tacoma Christian Center Church in 2 partnership with the Eastside Neighborhood Council of Tacoma, and 3 WHEREAS, while the street fair takes place in the McKinley Business 4 District, the district does not have an active association and is not a member of the 5 CDA, resulting in the McKinley Hill Street Fair not being included in the CDA 6 7 Program Pilot, and 8 WHEREAS, in lieu of an active business association, neighborhood groups 9 have filled the role of planning the business district street fair, which will spur 10 community and economic development, and have identified a need for financial 11 12 assistance for traffic control devices, estimated to be \$500, and 13 WHEREAS, at the August 7, 2018, Study Session, Council Member Ushka 14 shared a Council Consideration Request to authorize the one-time use of City 15 Council Contingency Funds, in an amount up to \$500, for expenses related to 16 traffic control devices for the McKinley Hill Street Fair, and 17 WHEREAS City staff will negotiate and execute an agreement for services, 18 19 outlining the scope of work and deliverables for the City's contribution, and 20 WHEREAS RCW 35.33.145 and 35.34.250 authorize a withdrawal from the 21 City Council Contingency fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of 22 which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of 23 adopting the budget, and 24 25 26



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	WHEREAS the need for funding related to traffic control devices for the
1	McKinley Hill Street Fair could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at
2	the time the City adopted its biennial budget, and
3 4	WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less
5	than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now,
6	Therefore,
7	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
8	Section 1. That one-time funding in an amount up to \$500, budgeted from
9	the City Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for expenses related to
10 11	traffic control devices for the McKinley Hill Street Fair.
12	Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby directed to negotiate and
13	execute an agreement, outlining the specific use of the funds and the deliverables
14	described in Section 1 above.
