## COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Community Vitality and Safety Committee

Council Member Blocker, Chair of the Community Vitality and Safety Committee, reported at the June 28, 2018 meeting, the Committee forwarded one candidate to the full City Council for appointment to the Commission on Immigrant and Refugee Affairs and received a presentation on tenant rights and a relocation assistance fund. At the July 12, 2018 meeting, the Committee heard a presentation on the Human Rights Commission's annual report. He concluded that the next meeting will be on August 9, 2018, and will include interviews for the Tacoma Area Commission on Disabilities and a follow up discussion on tenant rights and relocation assistance.

Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee (Continued from the July 17, 2018 meeting)

Deputy Mayor Ibsen, Vice Chair of the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, reported at the June 13, 2018 meeting, the Committee received briefings on the challenges of synchronizing traffic lights, the Integrated Resource Plan, and an update from the Northwest Seaport Alliance on Tacoma Maritime Air Emissions progress. He stated the June 27, 2018 meeting was cancelled, and at the July 11, 2018 meeting, the Committee received an update on the Transportation Master Plan targets and measures, infill housing, and the Planning Commission's work program. At the July 16, 2018 special meeting, the Committee was briefed on the future of urban forestry and the Schuster Parkway Promenade project. He concluded by stating the July 25, 2018 meeting was cancelled, and the next meeting will be on August 8, 2018, which will include interviews for the Transportation Commission and a follow-up discussion on traffic light synchronization.
