
Cost & Schedule Snapshot





COMMERCES ST./STADIUM WAY (S1)



- Utility Work (water line, sewer and storm)
- Install Traction Power Substation (TPSS)
- Trackway and station platforms; Overhead Contact System (OCS) foundations/poles
- Traffic signalization/street light improvements at four locations
- Road restoration, ADA curb ramps
- MOT: single lane closures/two-way traffic
- Constraints: cutover at Commerce/S. 9th two phases

STADIUM HIGH SCHOOL (S2)



- Utility Work (water, sewer and storm lines)
- Trackway— one lane traffic
- Enhanced pedestrian signal
 - North 1st St./N. Broadway
- OCS foundations/poles
- Road restoration, ADA curb ramps
- Constraints: Summer work @ Stadium High School

- TPSS

- Road restoration, ADA curb ramps
- Constraints: Holiday moratorium



- Challenges: pedestrian under crossings at MultiCare

LABOR OUTREACH

 - Sound Transit will apply the relevant provisions of its Project Labor Agreement to support economic opportunities for Hilltop residents



***TACOMA DOME LINK EXTENSION



Federal Way Transit Center to Tacoma Dome

- Length: 9.7 miles
- Stations: 4 (parking at 2 stations)
- Daily Project Riders: 27,000-37,000 (2040)
- Cost: \$1.85 to \$2.03 billion (2014\$)

Operations and Maintenance Facility (OMF): South

OPERATIONS & MAINTENANCE *** FACILITY (OMF): SOUTH



- Included in ST3 Plan
- Cost: \$501 to \$537 million (2014\$)
- Location and size supports system expansion of multiple projects (TDLE and overall system expansion)
- Process
 - ➤ Pre-Screen: July-Sept 2018
 - ➤ Level 1 evaluation: Sept-Oct 2018
 - ➤ EIS Scoping: fall or winter 2018









Level 1 alternatives: South Federal Way





FIFE LEVEL 1 ALTERNATIVES

TACOMA DOME LINK EXTENSION DRAFT 09/04/18



I-5 West to 12th Street

- > Less TOD and station access potential
- Longer alignment length compared to other alternatives

› Alignment supports City Center Vision

Pacific Hwy West/15th Street

Highest TOD and station access potential

Pacific Hwy East/Pacific Hwy South/I-5 to 99

- > Alignment supports City Center Vision
- > Highest TOD and station access potential
- More potential for congestion along SR 99 and 54th Street

I-5 West/Representative

- Potential constructability and WSDOT I-5 right-of-way challenges between SR 167 and 54th Street
- > Least TOD potential
- More potential for congestion along SR 99 and 54th Street

1-5 Median

- Additional structures and pedestrian overcrossings required
- Median space constraints would require freeway widening
- > More highway congestion during construction

I-5 East

- Outside of City Center Vision area; less TOD potential
- Many impacts to wetlands
- Most constructability challenges with SR 167 interchange



Puyallup Ave

- Station located farthest from activity center south of I-5
- > Crosses sensitive tribal cultural area

25th Street

- Station located farther from activity center south of I-5
- Puyallup River crossing at least impactful location

26th Street/Representative

- > Stations located near activity center south of I-5
- > Puyallup River crossing at least impactful location

Representative

- > Stations located near activity center south of I-5
- > Puyallup River crossing at least impactful location

27th Street

- > Station located near activity center south of I-5
- > Puyallup River crossing at least impactful location

I-5 South

- > Stations located at activity center south of I-5
- > Highest property impacts, including tribal property
- > Puyallup River crossing at most impactful location
- Requires complex structure over I-5

Puyallup Ave

- Potential property impacts on south side of Puyallup Avenue
- Highest TOD potential
- > Crossing under I-705 to extend line to Tacoma Mall is most challenging

25th Street

- > Highest potential for multimodal connections
- Crossing under I-705 to extend line to Tacoma Mall is more challenging
- TD 2 would impact Freighthouse Square

26th Street

Representative

- Crossing under I-705 to extend line to Tacoma Mall is least challenging
- > Station is located on tribal-owned property
- › Lower potential for TOD and multimodal connections

27th Street

I-5 South

- Potential constructability challenges through steep slope area
- Crossing under I-705 to extend line to Tacoma Mall is least challenging
- Lower potential for TOD and multimodal connections
