2. Economic Development Report for Week of September 24, 2018

Infoblox, which announced the location of its Center of Excellence in Technology Innovation in Tacoma at 2106 Pacific Avenue in June, 2017, is on track to meet its original hiring estimate of 150 employees by the end of 2018. The company has grown from 45 employees to 130 since it announced its expansion and currently has 24 positions posted for its Tacoma office. It has also expanded its footprint and now has offices on four floors of the Horizon Pacific Center.

Headquartered in Santa Clara California, Infoblox is an industry leader in Domain Name System (DNS), Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP), and Internet Protocol (IP) address management and maintains a partnership with University of Washington Tacoma's School of Engineering and Technology to conduct research with and provide internships to students in the Masters of Cybersecurity and Leadership program.
