

- Formed in 1970: Nuclear power
- "One-stop permitting"
- Council: State agencies and local government during site certification review
- Council oversees compliance with environmental regulation and safety throughout the life of the facility

#### **EFSEC Project Location Map**






# Supporting the Transition to Clean, Renewable Energy



- Adding clean energy as one of the elements EFSEC must balance (intent section of the law)
- Streamlining processes for renewable energy







- Creating a preapplication process
  - Earlier engagement with developers and local government
- Combining two hearings into one
- Completing environmental review before starting adjudication
- Waiving adjudication when it's unnecessary
- Fixing the "two bites of the apple" problem

# Enhancing Engagement with Local Governments and Tribes




- Early notification and engagement with affected local governments and tribes
  - Requirement to "ensure meaningful participation and input during siting review and compliance monitoring"
- Strengthening the voice of cities and counties through creation of permanent, standing membership positions on the Council
- Adding permanent, standing membership for Tribes
