

BACKGROUND





These crashes are happening in every corner of our city – but some neighborhoods are more affected than others.

••• ENGINEERING

- Lister Elementary (\$450,115 WA SRTS grant)
- First Creek Middle School (\$318,885 WA SRTS grant)
- Blix and Stanley Elementary (2017-2018 Council Budget)
- School Beacons at 14 schools (2017-2018 Council Budget)
- Infrastructure improvements at 2 schools (2019-2020 Council Budget)
- Walking & biking audits (2019-2020 Council Budget)
- School Beacons at 9 schools (2019-2020 Council Budget)
- Collaboration on new schools Birney, Browns Pt, Boze Elementary








••• EQUITY

CITY OF THE CITY OF THE COMA

- Hired a full-time SRTS Coordinator
- Provided additional support to under-resourced schools that may have limited volunteer capacity
- Engaged traditionally underrepresented groups









• • • EDUCATION

- ES STATE CITY OF THE COMMAN
- Received \$60,000 WTSC grant to develop pedestrian curriculum for all elementary school students
- Training middle school PE teachers to implement bicycle safety curriculum
- Promoting bike clubs in middle and high school
- Holding bike rodeos in the spring
- Providing safety information for inclusion into school newsletters








••• ENCOURAGEMENT

- STATE CITY OF THE CITY OF THE
- City Council proclaimed October as Walk and Roll to School Month
- Thirteen schools participated using resource kits provided by the City and TPCHD
- Promoted SRTS at school and community events
- Holding school assemblies, bike rodeos, and meeting with parent groups
- Working with schools to develop walking school buses











• • • ENFORCEMENT

- Reviewed new locations and installing speed enforcement cameras
- Developed and promoted neighborhood/school zone motorist safety campaign
- Reduced barriers to following the law by giving away helmets
- Deployed radar trailer at schools







NEXT STEPS

- Implement SRTS projects at Blix, First Creek, Lister and Stanley
- Complete SRTS Annual Report

Tacoma Public Schools

- Create inter-departmental SRTS working group to meet monthly
- Lead partnership on bike/ped safety curriculum development to meet new health standards

Metro Parks Tacoma

- Partner to address safe access to co-located sites; e.g., First Creek
- Continue working with partners to expand Safe Routes to Parks

Tacoma-Pierce County Health Dept.

- Partner on injury prevention efforts
- Evaluate health grants for SRTS funding
