- PDS Reported out on the Commercial Zoning Update and request to partnership on hosting community meetings on the subject
- Reviewed TPS Peach Jar communication tool for use by Neighborhood Councils

Cross District Association (CDA) (Shari Hart, CED) – Mike Slevin

- Mike Slevin discussed budget meetings and rate increases for power, water, sewer, garbage; presentation to council is on Oct 16
- Tacoma Creates continues to be broadly unsupported as a tool to fund the arts
- For October CDA Training meeting they plan to have a meeting about events and invite permitting and Fire staff and discuss the high cost of event insurance (Hilltop paid \$3400 for their one day event)

North End (Will Suarez, CMO)-Bill Fosbre

- The McCarver crossing intersection still has wayside horns that are very noisy. Residents are under the impression the wayside horns will be removed once the pedestrian gates and street gates are installed
- Wanted to know if a consultant representing the interest of the public could be hired as found in the Charter to look at the utility proposed rate increases. TPU was present
- Would like the City to require parking and have design guidelines for Detached Accessory Dwelling Units
- Interest was expressed to have library branches be opened 6 to 7 days a week
- Would like the City to offer incentives for new construction to be able to capture rainwater and use it for flushing toilets, or incentives for the construction of stormwater purification systems

Northeast Tacoma (Lynda Foster, CMO) – Randy Lewis

- City Manager budget listening session was held and concerns arose around: property tax cap impacting NE Tacoma more than some other neighborhoods; public works and roads; more specific information desired about TPU & ES rate increases
- Presentation by Schnitzer Steel staff on: noise plan review/Q&A.
 Concerns about noise made at night when loading ships
- Questions on Tideflats Subarea Plan and NETNC seat at the table in discussions
- Approval to fund Purple Air Monitor project in NE Tacoma

South End (Bucoda Warren, CMO) – Linda Stewart


- City Manager budget listening session was held and concerns arose water and air pollution, how much the city has lost in MFPTE projects, and public safety
- Public safety- specifically in the 72nd and Pacific strip mall was addressed and Lt. Darlington was able to provide numbers about the reductions in transient activity
- Concerns were expressed with students leaving Lincoln high school during lunch as a closed campus, syringes on school grounds, Pacific Ave crosswalk by Stewart Middle School
- Gas Station and Biker Memorial
 Park updates were presented by City
 Manager Rep. and the SENCO board
 will decide next meeting whether to
 adopt park or push the City to void
 maintenance agreement and take the
 park back
- NOTICE- Members of the SENCO board brought up a vote to re-elect the entire board and officers in November due to a bylaws violation. The violation voiced was that some members of board had been mistakenly telling others that there needed to be 2 years of service on SENCO before you could become an officer. This was not stated in the bylaws and the members who brought the motion believed a reset was in order to restore fairness as the false statements about 2 years experience needed had kept many people from applying over the years. This vote failed 4-4 with one abstain, one absence, and one board member leaving due to the bickering before the vote

Request for Annexation of 8717 McKinley Avenue East

On October 9, 2018, the City Council will consider a resolution to acknowledge the receipt of an application for annexation and set October 23, 2018 as the date for a public meeting with the applicant.

The property owner, ABM Construction, LLC, has filed a Notice of Intention to Commence Annexation Proceedings for two parcels of property located at 8717 McKinley Avenue East in unincorporated Pierce County. The 4.4-acre site is near the southwest corner of the City, adjacent to Council District 5, and is highlighted in the map insert.

The Council's action on October 9th — simply to set a public meeting — is administrative and does not involve any decision-making on the application. However, staff recognizes that this is a fairly unique process and one that the Council has not seen for many years, and thus would like to provide a little background information:

1. Why is the applicant seeking the annexation?

The applicant indicates that they are seeking annexation to gain access to the City's sewer system and facilitate the development of the site into a multi-lot, single-family residential neighborhood. Without access to the City's sewer system, the project would have to be constructed with septic systems.

2. What happens at the public meeting?

While not technically a public hearing, the public meeting on October 23rd will be conducted during the Council's



regular meeting in a fairly similar manner. The Council will call the special public meeting to order, receive a briefing from staff, and accept testimony from citizens wishing to voice approval or disapproval of the proposed annexation. At the conclusion of the public meeting, the Council will determine whether the City shall accept, reject, or geographically modify the proposed annexation.

3. What does it mean if the Council accepts the proposed annexation?

Accepting the proposal, with or without modifications, does not commit the Council to ultimately annexing the territory; it merely allows the proposal to move forward procedurally. If moved forward, the Council would not make a decision on the annexation proposal until it has proceeded through many additional reviews, which often takes 12 to 18 months, or longer. As outlined in State law, this annexation method generally consists of the following sequential steps:



In preparation for the public meeting on October 23rd, staff will prepare additional information regarding the details of the proposal, applicable policies and regulations, and any concerns and considerations the Council should be aware of in making its decision on whether to accept, reject or geographically modify the proposal. That information will be provided to Council in a future weekly report and will be summarized by staff during our presentation at the public meeting.
