ITEM/ISSUE PROPOSED FOR COUNCIL CONSIDERATION:

I ask for your support for the inclusion of the following item on the agenda at the earliest available meeting of the Study Session:

\$25,000 of Council Contingency Funding to support the Pierce County Complete Count Committee and ensure a thorough and accurate 2020 Census in the City of Tacoma, to be directed to the Greater Tacoma Community Foundation (GTCF) "Pierce Census 2020" Fund.

BRIEF BACKGROUND:

The United States Census Count is the basis for many important fiscal decisions, including the allocation of State and Federal funding. Additionally, businesses use this data when choosing where to launch products or build new stores. Historically, local governments and community groups have played a key role in educating and motivating residents to participate in the Census by forming "Complete Count Committees."

In 2010, the City of Tacoma operated a Complete Count Committee independently. However, partnership with countywide partners has the potential to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of Census outreach and education efforts. For Census 2020, the Auditor's Office is taking the lead on the Census Count in Pierce County in partnership with GTCF. They have connected to the statewide "Complete Count Committee," with a State Office of Financial Management staff person participating in the work group. They welcome assistance and are seeking active involvement from all local jurisdictions.

Public outreach for this Pierce County effort is estimated to be \$250,000. Some funds may be pooled with the King County Complete Count Committee for media buys to extend the reach of the campaign (because most major media outlets are located in Seattle), but the majority of funds will be used for local outreach tailored to reach Pierce County's "Hard to Count" population, which will require translation, outreach, and grassroots engagement.

In addition to a potential question on citizenship status being added to the 2020 Census, there are two other significant changes that may require additional outreach: 1.) Active military personnel will be included in 2020, a broad departure from past counts; and 2.) The Census Bureau is aiming to have 70% of survey completed online.

The proposed City of Tacoma contribution to this effort will help ensure a complete count and prevent the potential loss of State and Federal dollars through underrepresentation of Tacoma residents. This funding includes allocations to schools, hospitals, and more, and is key to services that provide for the wellbeing of all of Tacoma's residents.
