SUMMARY:

Neighborhood and Community Services (NCS) requests approval for the award of 21 contracts to multiple agencies as listed below for Human and Social Support Services for a cumulative total amount of \$15,692,416.69, plus applicable taxes. The total contracted amount represents 21 contracted agencies operating 57 programs. These contracts are budgeted from the General Fund (31), the Mental Health Substance Use Disorder Fund (24), and a combination of multiple sources including Criminal Justice (2), for the period of January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2020.

STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

- A safe, clean, and attractive community.
- Strengthen and support public safety, human services, public education, and diverse higher learning opportunities in Tacoma.
- Encourage and promote an open, effective, and results-oriented organization.

BACKGROUND:

NCS contracts with local providers who align with Tacoma 2025, Council Priorities, and the Department Goals to provide resources to various populations in the community.

NCS manages four main portfolios for contracted investment:

- Homelessness and Household Stability
- Community Mobilization
- Social Wellness
- Opportunity & Achievement

A Direct Negotiation Waiver (DNW) was approved for Homelessness and Household Stability (HHS), and Community Mobilization. All other programs (Social Wellness, and Opportunity & Achievement) were required to apply for funding for the 2019 – 2020 Biennium, with the exception of programs tied to Interlocal Agreements, and previously competitively solicited contracts with automatic renewals.

ISSUE: The Human Services Commission (HSC) reviewed all eligible applications for funding and presented recommendations, based on whether programs are appropriately aligned with Tacoma 2025, Council Priorities, and Department Goals. All funding recommendations are contingent on Council approval of the 2019-2020 budget and Council's approval of NCS contracts over \$200K. Funding recommendation are programs that support homelessness, household stability, social wellness, opportunity & achievement, and community mobilization.

At the October 11, 2018 meeting, the Community Vitality and Safety (CVS) committee recommended forwarding NCS funding recommendations to City Council for approval. <u>Appendix A</u> provides a detailed spreadsheet of the specifics for each agency, service provided, source of funding, and contract amount.

ALTERNATIVES: City Council may request Staff and the Human Services Commission conduct a secondary review of the recommendations or provide further guidance on funding allocations, should the proposed funding recommendations not be approved.

COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION:

Request for Proposals Specification No. NC18-0177F was opened August 21, 2018. There were 298 providers invited to bid, in addition to normal advertising of the project. Sixty-one submittals were received. Programs submitted applications answering questions on how their programs met the critical needs of the community. cultural responsiveness, effective practices, system impact, accessibility, program evaluation, and how the program aligns with Tacoma 2025, Council Priority, and Department Goals.

Programs were invited to participate in oral presentations in front of the HSC. The HSC rated each program individually and during a consensus meeting made recommendations for funding based on each program's merits and ability to achieve funding priorities (which included health and health care, domestic violence, youth development gang prevention and intervention, educational support services, financial empowerment, and workforce development. HSC raters received reliability training, and resource information to assist with making data informed decisions).
