1 2	BY REQUEST OF MAYOR WOODARDS AND COUNCIL MEMBERS McCARTHY AND THOMS		
3	A RESOLUTION authorizing the one-time use of City Council Contingency Funds, in an amount of up to \$5,000, for expenses related to the Pierce County		
4	Opioid Summit 2019.		
5	WHEREAS, in 2017, Pierce County declared a "State of Opioid Crisis,"		
6	which paralleled a Presidential declaration, and sent a letter to Governor		
7 8	Jay Inslee, urging him to declare Pierce County in a state of emergency, and		
9	WHEREAS the City filed a lawsuit against three opioid manufacturers in		
10	2017, with Pierce County following suit in early 2018, and		
11	WHEREAS, also in 2017, Pierce County Council Member Young and		
12	Tacoma City Council Member McCarthy convened representatives from multiple		
13 14	sectors to form the Tacoma-Pierce County Opioid Task Force ("Task Force"), and		
14	WHEREAS, in February 2018, the Task Force convened a community		
16	summit on the opioid epidemic to receive input for an action plan, with more than		
17	150 leaders from cities, healthcare, social services, fire, public health, law		
18	enforcement, and criminal justice joining in the discussion, and WHEREAS members of Pierce County's Congressional Delegation were

21	also in attendance, and		
22	WHEREAS Task Force leaders used this information to formulate an action		
23	plan, focusing on wellness and the full spectrum of prevention in its three domains:		
24	(1) prevention/education; (2) access to treatment; and (3) ensuring "the right

26	services at the right time," and

WHEREAS Task Force leaders recruited volunteers to serve on committees 1 under each of these domains to refine goals and work plans, and the committees 2 are currently executing their work plans, and 3 WHEREAS the Task Force will reconvene a broad group of community 4 leaders to report on its work and outcomes at the Pierce County Opioid Summit 5 2019, and 6 7 WHEREAS the summit will be critical for defining the purpose and scope of 8 the Task Force's continued work in 2019 and beyond, and 9 WHEREAS, at the December 11, 2018, Study Session, a Council 10 Consideration Request was shared to use up to \$5,000 of City Council Contingency 11 Funds for expenses related to the Pierce County Opioid Summit 2019 event, and 12 13 WHEREAS RCW 35.33.145 and 35.34.250 authorize a withdrawal from the 14 City Council Contingency fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent 15 of which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of 16 adopting the budget, and 17 18 WHEREAS the need for funding related to the Pierce County Opioid 19 Summit 2019 could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time 20 the City adopted its biennial budget, and 21 WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less 22 than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now, 23 24 Therefore, 25 26 -2-
