ITEMS OF INTEREST

- 2. On February 21, 2019, the Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department will present an award recognizing the City of Tacoma's Livable City Year (LCY) project with its Healthy Communities Platinum Award for 2018. The award recognizes the immediate and long-term positive impacts of Tacoma's LCY Program on public health and sustainable development. The Healthy Communities awards will be jointly presented by Board of Health Chair Catherine Ushka and Board member Derek Young on February 21, 2019, at the Pierce County Regional Council General Assembly. GRANT AWARDS

- 6. The City has applied for the following grant:
 - Washington State Health Care Authority Opioid Response Grant Funds will be used to develop and initiate a mobile unit that will provide medical interventions inclusive of withdrawal stabilization, referrals, counseling, and case management. The mobile unit operations will begin March 1, 2019 through December 31, 2020, unless extension funding is awarded. The mobile unit will be staffed with one registered nurse and will respond to any opioid related incident that is identified on-scene by 911-EMS or 911-Police, with the goal to initiate opioid treatment immediately to save lives and prevent relapse. The City match required.

On February 21, 2019, the Tacoma Pierce County Health Department will present an award recognizing the City of Tacoma's Livable City Year (LCY) project with its Healthy Communities Platinum Award for 2018. The award recognizes the immediate and long-term positive impacts of Tacoma's LCY Program on public health and sustainable development.

BACKGROUND:

The LCY Program is an initiative led by University of Washington (UW) faculty that enables local government to tap into the talents and energy of the university to create livable communities. In 2017, the City applied for and was selected as the 2017-2018 LCY Community Partner. On August 15, 2017, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 39781 authorizing execution of an LCY Program agreement with UW with a maximum budget of \$350,000 to be completed in one year. The resolution budgeted departmental funds and staff time toward the effort, and established that Tacoma 2025 — Tacoma's Strategic Plan — would be the framework guiding the effort.

Through this fruitful partnership, two campuses, dozens of faculty members, and hundreds of students from multiple disciplines, mobilized with City staff and community members to undertake 27 community projects, all focused on improving equity and livability in Tacoma. Each project was co-lead by a joint team including City staff from multiple departments, teamed with a UW faculty member from UW colleges with pertinent expertise. The Healthy Communities awards will be jointly presented by Board of Health Chair Catherine Ushka and Board member Derek Young on February 21, 2019, at the Pierce County Regional Council General Assembly.
