## **RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY:**

The Public Works Department recommends a contract be awarded to Asphalt Patch Systems, Puyallup, WA, for the installation of missing link sidewalk, ADA-compliant curb ramps, and video-detection signal improvements on South 19<sup>th</sup> Street between South Prospect Street and South Cedar Street, in the amount of \$397,703.00, plus a 15 percent contingency, for a cumulative total of \$457,358.45, plus any applicable taxes, budgeted from the 1060-PRGM PW Street Programs Fund.

### STRATEGIC POLICY PRIORITY:

- Strengthen and support a safe city with healthy residents.
- Ensure all Tacoma residents are valued and have access to resources to meet their needs.

The project will improve pedestrian safety, accessibility and promote active transportation.

### **BACKGROUND:**

There is approximately 1,200 linear feet of missing link sidewalk on the south side of South 19<sup>th</sup> Street between South Prospect Street near the Bates Technical College campus and South Cedar Street. This section of South 19<sup>th</sup> Street is a popular walking route between residential areas and commercial, recreational, and medical facilities.

ISSUE: South 19<sup>th</sup> Street is a designated school walking route for Stanley Elementary School between South Prospect Street and South Wilkeson Street. Many students walking on South 19<sup>th</sup> Street continue west of South Prospect Street and cross through the intersection of South Cedar Street. Currently the signalized intersection of South 19<sup>th</sup> Street and South Cedar Street operates with non-compliant ADA curb ramps and pedestrian signaling.

ALTERNATIVES: The alternative to this project is to leave the curb ramps and pedestrian signaling non-compliant with ADA standards and to not install the missing link sidewalk on the south side of South 19<sup>th</sup> Street, forcing pedestrians to use the sidewalk on the north side of the street.

## **COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION:**

Request for Bids Specification No. PW18-0389F was opened on February 19, 2019. No companies were invited to bid in addition to normal advertising of the project. Seven (7) submittals were received. Asphalt Patch Systems submitted a bid that resulted in the lowest evaluated submittal after consideration of Small Business Enterprise (SBE) participation goals.

Pre-bid Estimate: \$410,487.85

The recommended award is three percent below the pre-bid estimate. Based on the estimated working days, staff believes this project will result in 1,691 labor hours.

## CONTRACT HISTORY: New contract

SUSTAINABILITY: This project will improve the City's infrastructure and improve the safety of all pedestrians by installing ADA-compliant walkways.

SBE/LEAP COMPLIANCE: Asphalt Patch Systems submitted the lowest evaluated bid per the SBE regulation requirements, and the next lowest bidder was not within 5 percent of the low bidder. Therefore, the SBE office recommends award to Asphalt Patch Systems. The project has a Local Employment and Apprenticeship Training Program (LEAP) utilization requirement of 15 percent.
