#### **ITEMS OF INTEREST**

1. City Offices will be closed next Thursday, July 4<sup>th</sup> for Independence Day; therefore, your agenda packets and the Weekly Report will be sent out Wednesday, July 3<sup>rd</sup> for the July 9<sup>th</sup> City Council meetings.

### STUDY SESSION/WORK SESSION

2. The City Council Study Session of Tuesday, July 2, 2019, will be held in Room 16 of the Tacoma Municipal Building North, at Noon. Discussion items will include: (1) Environmental Action Plan; (2) Facilities Tour Debrief and Facilities Assessment Overview; (3) Other Items of Interest; (4) Committee Reports; and, (5) Agenda Review and City Manager's Weekly Report.

Each year during Earth Month, the City releases its latest assessment of the state of our environment. As the first item on Tuesday's Study Session agenda, the Office of Environmental Policy and Sustainability staff will give an overview of the 2018 annual Environmental Action Plan Progress Report. The overview will include progress towards meeting targets, accomplishing actions and highlight key inter-departmental and community partnership successes.

In addition at Tuesday's Study Session, there will be a facilities tour debrief and Facilities Assessment Overview. The discussion will provide the City Council Members an opportunity to discuss the tours of City facilities and for staff to provide an overview of current facility conditions.

#### **COUNCIL REQUESTS/INQUIRIES**

In response to a question raised by Council Member Ibsen during the last Study Session regarding **Substitute House Bill 1406** (retail sales tax related to affordable and supportive housing), the City Attorney's Office reports that with the revenue from the shared state tax approximately \$10 million could be bonded. Cities may enter into an interlocal agreement with one or more other counties, cities, or housing authorities to provide the affordable or supportive housing. Staff will be reviewing how best to utilize this money and make related recommendations in the future.
