## **ITEMS OF INTEREST**

#### SUMMARY:

The purpose of this memo is to provide a summary of topics and concerns discussed at the eight neighborhood councils and the Community Council of Tacoma during the month of July. These items have been identified by the City Manager's Office liaison to each council as important or useful to bring to the Council's and City Leadership's attention for the month of July.

### TOPICS DISCUSSED:

## West End Neighborhood Council

For the month of August, the West End Neighborhood Council will be taking a break and not have a meeting.

#### New Tacoma Neighborhood Council

New Tacoma discussed the idea of a litter pick-up day across Tacoma and has written a letter of support to the Mayor and City Council for this event (attached). They are proposing Saturday, October 26, 2019 as this event across Tacoma and are asking the City to publicize and support the event. New Tacoma will be asking other Neighborhood Councils and the Community Council for support and assistance in rallying volunteers for the day. The Neighborhood and Community Services and Media and Communications Office staff are aware of the proposal and will be working on options to publicize the event.

#### **CONCERNS SHARED:**

#### West End Neighborhood Council

Members of the Board and Members of the West End Neighborhood Council are currently in litigation. Details have not been made available to staff. Staff is not engaged in these litigation discussions and at this time will continue attending as a staff liaison. This information is provided for your awareness in that neighborhood.

#### East Tacoma Neighborhood Council

East Tacoma continues to share concerns regarding the displacement of businesses due to Bus Rapid Transit along Pacific Avenue. They have also continued to ask for a Business Improvement Area in the East Side. Staff is aware of this request and has been working with businesses and the Economic Development Council Committee regarding additional BIAs in Tacoma.
