Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee (held over from the May 21, 2019 meeting)

Council Member Mello, Chair of the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee, reported at the April 24, 2019 meeting, the Committee received presentations on the Sustainable Tacoma Commission's work plan and renaming of the Puyallup River Bridge to the "Fishing Wars Memorial Bridge". He stated at the May 8, 2019 meeting, the Committee received presentations on Environmental Services' strategic plan and the Urban Design Studio. He concluded by stating at the May 22, 2019 meeting, the Committee interviewed applicants for the Planning Commission and received an update on the Building Code.

Community Vitality and Safety Committee

Council Member Blocker, Chair of the Community Vitality and Safety Committee, reported at the May 9, 2019 meeting, the Committee interviewed applicants for the Tacoma Community Redevelopment Authority Board, recommended three applicants for appointment, and received a presentation on the Northwest Detention Center. He stated at the May 23, 2019 meeting, the Committee interviewed applicants for the Human Services Commission and recommended three applicants for reappointment and four for appointment. He concluded by reporting the next meeting will be on June 13, 2019, and will include presentations on reducing emergency medicine treatment errors, a Rental Housing Code amendment, and South Sound 911 restructure.

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Council Member Ushka stated the Eastside Farmers Market, located at South 35th Street and South McKinley Avenue, is open every Tuesday now through August 27, 2019, at 3:00 p.m.

Council Member Mello stated the Tacoma Ocean Fest will take place on Sunday, June 9, 2019, at Foss Waterway Seaport, located at 705 Dock Street, at 10:00 a.m.
