## **RESOLUTION NO. 40435**

- A RESOLUTION authorizing the execution of an interagency agreement with the 1 Washington State Department of Ecology, in an amount not to exceed 2 \$426,400, budgeted from the Surface Water Fund, to assist in the maintenance and restoration of the City's habitat restoration sites and 3 passive open spaces, beginning October 7, 2019 through September 10, 2020. 4
- 5 WHEREAS the City participates in the Washington Conservation Corps "WCC") program, which is an AmeriCorps program administered by the Washington State Department of Ecology ("Ecology") that provides young adults
- with job and life skills, and an educational stipend at program completion, and 9

- WHEREAS, WCC provides knowledgeable and skilled crews to restore and
- 11 maintain passive open spaces, which require a routine presence for invasive
  - species control, debris removal, and native plant installation and maintenance, and
- 13 WHEREAS the City's Environmental Services Department ("ES") has begun 14
- restoration and stewardship activities on City-owned passive open space 15
- 16 properties to retain and increase surface water benefits, and
- 17 WHEREAS invasive vegetation currently threatens the ecosystem health of 18 the City's open spaces, and examples of passive open space restoration efforts 19 include the creation and implementation of the Schuster Slope, Mason Gulch, and 20 Salmon Beach Slope landscape management plans, and 21
- 22 WHEREAS the City has sponsored a WCC for 18 years, which has allowed 23 the City to provide environmental maintenance and improvements in a cost 24 effective manner, and

1	WHEREAS Ecology has allocated two WCC crews to the ES for the 2019-
2	2020 crew year, at a cost of \$213,200 per crew per year, for a total of \$426,400;
3	Now, Therefore,
4 5	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:
6	That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to enter into an
7	interagency agreement with the Washington State Department of Ecology, in an
8	amount not to exceed \$426,400, to assist in the maintenance and restoration of the
9	City's habitat restoration sites and passive open spaces, beginning October 7,
10	2019 through September 10, 2020.
