WALKING AUDITS

Elementary School Walking Audits


- Partnering with UW Tacoma to collect GIS data around 5 elementary schools
 - Blix, Manitou, Whitman, Mary Lyon, Edison
- · Help identify small to large project that could add more SRTS
- · Use data to update state-mandated school walking route maps
- · Support future grant applications




••• PED/BIKE COUNTS & FACILITY INVENTO

2018 City of Tacoma Road Safety Plan identified the need for data collection

- City-wide data collection effort (\$234,000 HISP grant)
 - · Median and traffic islands
 - · Missing sidewalks and width of sidewalks
 - Crosswalks (markings, signs, stop line, ramps)
 - Clear zone and fixed object inventory (poles installed in sidewalk)
- Help better understand why pedestrian and bicycle collisions occurring and if there is a relationship between the collision and the existing built infrastructure
- Estimated completion is fall 2020





SIDEWALK PROGRAM





- o ~150 complaints/year
- o Over 1,100 sites in backlog
- 2017/2018 program funded with \$500K REET
 - o 94 sites/0.7miles of sidewalk
- 2019/2020 Changes
 - Established a new sidewalk crew to address additional sites and provide flexibility
 - o Established low income funding stream
