1	BY REQUEST OF COUNCIL MEMBERS BEALE, BLOCKER, AND USHKA			
2	AN ORDINANCE relating to public accommodations; amending Chapter 1.29 of			
3	the Tacoma Municipal Code by the addition thereto of a new Section 1.29.190, to be known as "Provision of Universal Closed			
4	Captioning," to require persons owning or managing a place of public accommodations to activate closed captioning on television receivers			
5	located within the City; and declaring an effective date.			
6	WHEREAS the purpose of the Tacoma Area Commission on Disabilities			
7 8	("TACOD") is to remove barriers and promote the rights of all persons with			
9	disabilities to make Tacoma accessible for everyone; and to advise, educate,			
10	collaborate, and serve as a resource for the City on issues and laws for people			
11	with disabilities, and			
12	WHEREAS TACOD is authorized to advise, educate, collaborate and			
13	advocate for and on behalf of people with disabilities, and provide			
14 15	recommendations to the City Council and the Community, Vitality and Safety			
16	("CVS") Committee, and			
17	WHEREAS all televisions broadcasts of programming in the United			
18	States include captions, and most television sets are capable of displaying			
19				
20	captions, but many businesses commonly do not enable closed captions, and			
21	WHEREAS current projections indicate that 35,000, or 4 percent of the			
22	regional population of Tacoma and Pierce County residents, are either deaf or			
23	hard of hearing; however, the current Tacoma Municipal Code does not			
24	specifically encompass the provision of closed captioning for persons in need of			
25 26	accommodations, and

	WHEREAS, in addition to benefitting members of the public who are deaf		
1	or hard of hearing, closed captioning benefits people with learning disabilities,		
2 3	sensory disabilities, attention deficits, and autism, as well as the elderly and		
3 4	persons learning English as a second language, and		
5	WHEREAS, at its meeting of July 11, 2019, the CVS Committee was		
6	6 briefed on TACOD's recommendations relating to closed captioning in public		
7	places, and the committee recommended that an ordinance be prepared for		
8	its consideration, and		
9 10	WHEREAS, on September 26, 2019, staff from the Office of Equity and		
11	Human Rights presented the proposed ordinance to the CVS Committee, and		
12	the committee recommended that the ordinance be forwarded to the full City		
13	Council for consideration, and		
14	WHEREAS, so that the City may conduct outreach and education about this		
15 16	ordinance, staff is recommending an effective date of March 1, 2020; Now,		
17	Therefore,		
18	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:		
19	Section 1. That Chapter 1.29 of the Tacoma Municipal Code is hereby		
20	amended by the addition thereto of a new Section 1.29.190, to be known		
21 22	as "Provision of Universal Closed Captioning," as set forth in attached Exhibit "A."		
22	Section 2. That this ordinance shall become effective on March 1, 2020.		
24	Section 3. That the City Manager is hereby directed to support and		
25	conduct a broad education and outreach program to secure the full participation		
26	of establishments that fall within the ordinance.
