Sustainable Tacoma Commission Interviews
[Doris Sorum, City Clerk]

At approximately 4:35 p.m., Doris Sorum, City Clerk, stated that the Committee would be interviewing five applicants for two open positions on the Sustainable Tacoma Commission. She further stated that Marina Magana could not attend the interviews and provided a written response.

Discussion ensued regarding upcoming interviews, the number of applicants, the number of interviews, and the number of positions on other Commissions.

The Committee interviewed Evlondo Cooper, Frances Love, and David Thompson.

Alexzandria Garrett and Ashley Sloan were unable to attend the interviews.

Discussion ensued regarding candidates' qualifications, expanding the size of the Commission, and the remainder of the Commission interviews scheduled for the December 4, 2019 meeting.

## 2. <u>19-1210</u> Electric Vehicle Updates

At approximately 5:13 p.m., Cam LeHouillier, Manager, Power Energy Research and Development, presented the electric vehicle (EV) updates, including current market; House Bill 1512, noting the clarified utility role and spending constraints; question of governance; the Strategic Plan; the Action Plan; and timeline.

Discussion ensued regarding buying older EVs, battery life, and possible EV car share programs.

#### 3. 19-1181 Electric Vehicle Readiness Recommendation

[Kristi Lynett, Sustainability Officer, and Beth Jarot, Green Building Specialist, Office of Environmental Policy and Sustainability; Terry Forslund, Senior Principal Engineer, Planning and Development Services]

At approximately 5:44 p.m., Kristi Lynett, Sustainability Officer, Office of Environmental Policy and Sustainability (OEPS), made opening remarks and introduced Beth Jarot, Green Building Specialist, OEPS. Ms. Jarot presented the EV readiness recommendations, including issues; recommendation; EV readiness costs; incremental costs; the health, equity, and sustainability analysis, outreach; and next steps.

Discussion ensued regarding the definition of readiness, incentives, barriers to EV readiness, amendments to the International Builiding Code and parking space code, and accessible parking.

MOTION: Council Member Beale moved to forward the recommendations of staff, as supported by the Board of Building Appeals, to the full City Council for consideration.
