Tacoma Creates

Participatory, Planning & Budgeting coming to East Tacoma and South Tacoma

In 2019, community members from East Tacoma (98404) and South Tacoma (98409) will decide how to spend \$100,000 towards arts, culture, heritage, and/or science programs and services in their neighborhood.

Public Health Centers for Excellence, The City of Tacoma, and Tacoma Creates are working together to provide community-driven, participatory planning and budgeting opportunities in East Tacoma (98404) and South Tacoma (98409).

Tacoma Creates has allocated a \$100,000 investment for each neighborhood. East Tacoma and South Tacoma residents will have the opportunity to decide how to invest this money to make an impact in their communities.

Successful program proposals will enable East Tacoma and South Tacoma residents of all ages to:

- Decide on the arts, culture, heritage, and/or science programs that are most meaningful to them.
- ✓ Be more involved in their community.
- ✓ Be more civically engaged.

Intro:

- 1) What is Participatory, Planning, and Budgeting?
 - a. Participatory, Planning, and Budgeting is a democratic process that allows community members to directly decide how to spend part of a public budget.

2) What is our role?

a. Public Health Centers for Excellence, The City of Tacoma, and Tacoma Creates are working together to provide community- driven, participatory planning and budgeting opportunities in East Tacoma (98404) and South Tacoma (98409).

Phase I: Project Design (August-September)

- 1) Phase | Milestones:
 - a. Established the Advisory Committee for East Tacoma (9 members) and South Tacoma (3 members and growing) Advisory Committee members for South Tacoma. Advisory Committee members are a representative group of community members that provide community context and consult us through all phases in the PB process.
 - b. Created an East Tacoma Guidebook in collaboration with Tacoma Creates and the East Tacoma Advisory Committee. We are finalizing the South Tacoma Guidebook.
 - c. Created an idea collection survey instrument in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Korean.
 - d. Promoted Tacoma Creates PB and PB as a health equity strategy in various platforms in East and South Tacoma (i.e. community meetings organizational meetings, community events, back to school nights, classrooms, after school clubs, radio stations, etc.).

2) Phase I Methods:

- a. Participant selection:
 - Those that live, work, attend school, or have children attending school in 98404 or 98409 zip-codes.
 - ii. Intentional about reaching out to give a voice to community members that have been least likely to be heard.

Phase II: Idea Collection (October- December)

- 1) Phase II Milestones:
 - a. Partnered with 25+ Tacoma Community College Interns to collect surveys at community events, at popular community spaces, and door-to-door in 98404 and 98409.
 - b. Attended 30+ community events and meetings to promote Tacoma Creates PB and idea collection.
 - c. Overall Survey Results: 1,077 total respondents with 2,801 total ideas
 - i. Collected 1,781 ideas in 98404 in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese
 - ii. Collected 1,020 ideas in 98409 in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese
 - d. Recruited 7-8 Budget Delegates from East and South Tacoma. Budget Delegates are community members that provide additional community context, prioritize ideas, and help write/research project proposals.
- 2) Idea Collection Methods:
- a. Paper and Electronic surveys (email or tablet):

- a. 98404 and 98409 schools
- b. Community events and meetings
- c. "Idea box" in businesses and community gathering spaces (e.g., community centers, etc.)
- d. Door-to-door outreach
- e. Via Social media (Tacoma Creates and Health Department)
- f. Via email with an ask to share out:
 - i. Internal partners (health department, Tacoma Creates, City of Tacoma)
 - ii. External partners (local agencies and organizations).

3) Next steps (Phase III, Phase IV, Phase V)

- a. Feasible project proposals will be ready for community members to vote (phase IV) in March.
- b. Project implementation begins in April 2020.
