SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

An ordinance vacating a portion of North Visscher Street, lying between North Park Way and North Park Avenue, to facilitate private improvements and landscaping.

BACKGROUND:

The Hearing Examiner's recommendation is based on the evidence and testimony presented at the public hearing held on January 9, 2020. The Vacation Area (as defined in the Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendation) consists of the easternmost five feet of the overall seventy-foot width of North Visscher Street, running for a north-south length of one hundred thirty-six feet along the front of Petitioners' residential real property at 5918 North Park Avenue. The Vacation Area is not currently used for any public purpose, nor is it improved as right-of-way. Approving the vacation will have no effect on public travel. City staff determined that there is no apparent future need for the Vacation Area. The vacation presents at least some public benefit because it adds the Vacation Area into the Petitioners' abutting real property for property tax purposes and facilitates private improvements which further add to the value of the Petitioners' real property and to the enhancement of the neighborhood.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:

A public hearing was held for this petition on January 9, 2020, at which members of the community could attend and speak to express their concerns with, and/or support for the proposed street vacation. No members of the public appeared. The street vacation will benefit the petitioners by allowing private improvements and landscaping in the vacation area. If approved, the vacation will not benefit or effect the surrounding community in the area other than by facilitating the Petitioners' intended landscaping/aesthetic improvements which will help to enhance the neighborhood.
