# **ITEMS OF INTEREST**

 The community is invited to attend the Annual South Sound Sustainability Expo on Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup>, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., at the Greater Tacoma Convention Center, located at 1500 Broadway.

This family friendly free event allows participants to discover services and products from companies and nonprofits that address sustainability needs in the local community, to include interactive workshops, arts and crafts, an animal and plant exhibit, a scavenger hunt, a screen printing station, and more!

The workshops this year will explore a zero waste lifestyle, sustainable self-care, and how to be a good advocate for your community. 3. On Wednesday, February 19<sup>th</sup>, **the Community and Economic Development Department and the Minority Business Development Agency-Tacoma Business Center hosted a roundtable discussion** with Congressman Derek Kilmer.

Eight Tacoma based woman and minority owned businesses participated in the Roundtable with **Rep. Kilmer and discussed the proposed Presidents 2021 elimination of the Economic Development Administration, Small Business Administration and entrepreneurial programs like the Minority Business Development Agency.** Rep. Kilmer reaffirmed his support of the MBDA-Tacoma business center and relayed his commitment to fight to and maintain the program on the House floor during the budget appropriations discussions. The Tacoma based MBEs shared stories of the immense support they received from the MBDA-Tacoma Business Center in growing their businesses and hiring more people.

**Rep. Kilmer stated, the MBDA-Tacoma Businesses center generates \$98 in return for every \$1 invested with MBES**. During fiscal year 2019, this center has created 214 jobs, retained 174, and secured \$27.4 M in contracts for Tacoma based businesses.


