Tacoma-Pierce County Health Department and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) also recommends that people over the age of 60 and people who have severe underlying chronic medical conditions like heart or lung disease or diabetes, should stay at home as much as possible to avoid crowds. The City Council meetings are televised on Channel 12 within the Tacoma City limits and Channel 21 in Pierce County, and streamed live at tvtacoma.com or on Facebook Live at facebook.com/cityoftacoma.

REPORTS BY THE CITY MANAGER

<u>20-0256</u> Update on the Cushman and Adams Substations Future Use Study.

City Manager Elizabeth Pauli reported that the items that would have been heard during study session would still be brought before the City Council, and introduced Deputy City Manager Tadd Wille.

Deputy City Manager Wille provided an update on the draft Tacoma-Lakewood Regional Consolidated Plan for 2020-2024.

Clark Mather, Government Relations Officer, Tacoma Public Utilities, and Elliott Barnett, Senior Planner, Planning and Development Services, provided an update on the revised public engagement plan on the future of the Cushman and Adams Substations and the Future Use Study, including visioning workshops, the study area, policy framework, the Future Use Study process, engagement with social distancing, a schedule and milestones, and next steps.

Discussion ensued regarding the ability to have a public meeting, surplusing the property, and the timeline.

City Manager Pauli reported that the number of positive COVID-19 cases has risen by 12 in Pierce County, nine of which were in the City of Tacoma.

COMMENTS AND COMMITTEE REPORTS OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Mayor Woodards stated that the City Council would conduct special meetings remotely on each Friday, at 2:00 p.m., as needed, until the Proclamation of Emergency has been terminated. She further stated that the purpose of the meetings will be for staff to provide information and respond

to questions from the City Council regarding the status of the City's response to the COVID-19 virus.

Various Council Members expressed appreciation and support to staff and constituents during this time.

Mayor Woodards provided updates regarding innovative solutions in the community and the impacts of the Governor's recent announcements.
