Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act



Use of Funds

The CARES Act specifies:

A State, Tribal government, and unit of local government shall use the funds to cover only those costs of the State, Tribal government, or unit of local government that:

- Are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19);
- 2. Were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of the date of enactment of this section for the State or government; and
- 3. Were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020 and ends on December 30, 2020.

Economic Stabilization and Recovery Programs - \$30 Million

- ➤ Preserve and Support Jobs

- ➤ Purchase Goods and Services to Support COVID-19 Response

County Council Legislation



Ordinance No. 2020-60

➤ An Emergency Ordinance of the Pierce County Council Relating to the COVID-19 Pandemic; Amending Ordinance No. 2019-86s, as Amended by Ordinance Nos. 2020-35, 2020-42, and 2020-54, the Biennial Budget of Pierce County for Fiscal Years 2020-2021; and Declaring an Emergency. (Emergency 2020-2021 Biennial Budget Supplemental) (2020)
