SUMMARY AND PURPOSE:

An ordinance related to the Business License Code, amending Sub-title 6B of the Tacoma Municipal Code (TMC), to add authority for the Finance Director to waive or extend license requirements when there is an economic recession or a state of emergency has been declared and the Director deems actions related to the Business License Code necessary to mitigate harm to the public health, safety and welfare.

BACKGROUND:

<u>The Departments Recommendation is Based On</u>: The City's licensing code includes regulatory license requirements for specific business industries to ensure the business operates safely and protects public health, safety and welfare.

The current state of emergency due to COVID-19 has greatly affected the local economy with some of the small local Tacoma businesses hit the hardest.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/ CUSTOMER RESEARCH:

Due to the recent COVID-19 pandemic and Stay Home Stay Healthy Order issued by the Governor, some of the local for-hire companies who have seen a large decrease in service requests during this time, contacted the Tax & License division inquiring whether some of the upcoming for-hire licensing requirements can be waived.

2025 STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:

Equity and Accessibility:

In an effort to support local businesses, the proposed amendment would allow the Director to waive or extend license requirements during an economic recession or declared emergency that would provide some relief to local businesses who fall under the City's licensing requirements.

Livability: *Equity Index Score*: Moderate Opportunity

Improve access and proximity by residents to diverse income levels and race/ethnicity to community facilities, services, infrastructure, and employment.

Explain how your legislation will affect the selected indicator(s).

An immediate issue related to the City's regulatory licensing program are upcoming requirements related to forhire vehicle renewals. Providing the Director the authority to allow for a one-time waiver of the vehicle age requirement and required annual inspection fee for the current licensing period will provide some temporary economic relief for the local for-hire companies.
